ABOUT US

Founded in response to growing economic hardship along Osceola County's Highway 192, Hope Partnership began in 2011 as a grassroots effort by Community Presbyterian Church and officially opened its doors as the Community Hope Center in 2013. What started as a small, volunteer-led initiative has grown into a comprehensive, trauma-informed organization offering a full continuum of care—including emergency relief, outreach, employment support, healthcare access, and vital identification services.

Over the years, Hope Partnership has collaborated with dozens of community agencies, walked alongside thousands of individuals and families, and launched programs like Hope Cares and Hope Works to address systemic barriers and expand opportunity. With a focus on dignity, connection, and long-term stability, we continue to grow—including the development of Thrive Studios an affordable housing community—because we believe everyone deserves a safe place to call home.

HOUSING AT A GLANCE

There are **67,107** extremely low-income renters in Central Florida and only **12,834**, available and attainable units. What about the remaining **54,273** renters? These families end up paying more than 50% of their income on rent, or they resort to living in situations that aren't stable, such as hotels, motels, or doubled up with other families.

95% of extremely low-income households are cost burdened, and there are only 19 units of housing per 100 households available



90% of low-income households are cost-burdened, and there are only 24 units of housing per 100 households available.

Families living in hotels, motels, doubled up or spending more than half their income on rent.
