Missy Raines is a trailblazer in bluegrass music.

On her newest release Highlander, the bassist/vocalist/
songwriter returns to her bluegrass roots with a musical
homage to the peaks and valleys of her native West
Virginia. Working again with producer Alison Brown,
she delivers a set of 10 songs featuring her touring band
Allegheny and including guest appearances from Laurie
Lewis, Dudley Connell, Danny Paisley, Kathy MaKea,
Michael Cleveland, Rob Ickes, Bronwyn Keith-Hynes,
Darol Anger, Shad Cobb and Alison Brown. Raines
explains: "Making this record and having this band has
been sort of a homecoming. I'm at a point in my life where
I've been able to look back at what I've gone through,
what I've done, and the path I ultimately wanted to take."

That path has taken Raines on a long and adventurous musical journey which has been informed by the Southern Appalachian and Mid-Atlantic bluegrass of her youth.

As a child and young teen, Raines soaked up the sounds of The Country Gentlemen, The Seldom Scene, The Johnson Mountain Boys, and the other neo-progressive groups that propelled bluegrass music forward in the 70s. In the early years of her career, she spent hours learning from and playing with many first-generation bluegrass legends and traveled extensively throughout the mid- Atlantic region. She says: "I can almost just go back [in my mind] and rely on those intrinsic things I learned as a 15-year-old in a field at a bluegrass festival — tapping into how I felt back then, and how I still feel today about this music."

Raines brings that intrinsic knowledge of the music to the forefront on her new project. In fact, she says that the Johnson Mountain Boys helped inspire the sound of her touring band Allegheny who perform brilliantly on each of the album's 10 tracks. Tristan Scroggins (mandolin, vocals) kicks off the album on the Gary Ferguson original "Listen to the Lonesome Wind,", a grooving, mid-tempo bluegrass track. Eli Gilbert (banjo) and Ellie Hakanson (fiddle, vocals) add incredible drive to "Fast Moving Train," a new train song that Raines calls a 'rare gem' which sounds like it could have come from Jimmie Rogers' canon. Ben Garnek (guitar, vocals) adds his def rhythm and lead guitar throughout, shining on interplay with Raines' bass on the instrumental "Panhandle Country" and "Looking to You," a Raines original reminiscent of her work with The New Hip in the early 2000s.

Taken as a whole, Raines' lifetime spent steeped in bluegrass is on full display on Highlander. Beyond the impressive array of guest musicians and the outstanding performances of her bandmates, it's Raines' extensive knowledge of and deep passion for bluegrass music that make Highlander a bluegrass album for the ages. And, for this musical adventurer, it's a love letter of sorts to the music and musical community that shaped her. "Ilove so many different kinds ofmusic," Raines says. "But I cannot describe how bluegrass affects me, and why it affects me so deeply."

Informed by the deep traditions of bluegrass, country, old-time, and Americana, The Boys have brought their unmistakeable and continually evolving sound to festival stages across the country.

Saddle up and join the Tone Rangers, a ragtag band of troubadours whose songs echo across the vast plains and dusty trails. From campfire ballads to saloon showdowns, this eclectic posse serenades the frontier with tales of adventure, heartache and redemption.

ACE-the mandolin maestro with fingers as fast and sharp as his wit. Whether he's plucking strings or placing bets, Ace always keeps his cool, turning every performance into a thrilling gamble where the odds are always in his favor. He is on a musical journey where every tune is a winning hand. With banjo rolls as fast as a speeding locomotive, the MIGHTY QUINN is a picker on a quest for fortune, weaving melodies that echo through the vast, open plains and rugged mountain trails. With each strum and pluck, he charts a course through the unknown bluegrass frontier.

In the smoky haze of dark saloons and moonlit campfires you'll find SLIM PICKINS and his guitar. With melodies, like whispers from another world, beckoning listeners into the unknown. Each note is a riddle, each chord a puzzle waiting to be solved. Come along for the ride but be careful not to get lost.

With a bass by his side, BIG MAC ensures that the rhythms of the band are steady and true, keeping harmony and order in the midst of the musical chaos. His presence is felt in every note, a pulse that resonates through the hearts of all who hear it. With a steady hand and a keen ear, he upholds the law of the low end.

alberta, canada (8pm friday, 6pm saturday)

Alberta's John Wort Hannam has been on his roots-fueled troubadour journey for two decades, spinning song writing gold from the chaff of the lives he has encountered an within his fertile imagination. Twenty years into his career, he shows no sign of slowing down. In fact, he appears to be gaining both momentum and a wider audience. Winning two 2023 Canadian Folk Music Awards for Solo Artist of the Year and Contemporary Album of the Year. John has enjoyed a lifelong passion for singing and audiences and critics hear something special in his narrative, lyrically driven songs. Effortlessly mixing rich and clear timbered vocals with lyrics that tug at the heart, his sound is both unique and familiar.

Born on the island of Jersey in the UK, he immigrated to Canada at the age of nine, and like a lot of performers, John began his singing career in a choir - the Calgary Boys Choir. He later discovered the guitar and his knack for writing songs in his early thirties while working as a teacher on the Kainai Nation in Blackfoot country. In 2001,

John guit his teaching job and made himself a promise - he would try his hand at writing songs for 10 months or until his employment insurance ran out. When time was up, if he had a handful of songs, he would record them. Those songs would become his first recording, Pocket Full of Holes, released in 2003. Twenty-one years later, the Alberta musician is recognized as one of the best folk roots songwriters in Alberta, has released 8 full length recordings, and has a few feathers in his hat that included a Juno Nomination, three Canadian Folk Music Awards, a coveted Kerrville, TX New Folk Songwriting Competition win and numerous other Canadian Folk Music Award and Western Canadian Music Award nominations.

We request that those campers using generators please restrict their use to between 9AM & 9PM.

Only propane fire pits and similar items are allowed.

Please deposit all trash in receptacles provided during and at the end of your stay. Please note that onsite security is provided throughout the event, however Foothills Bluegrass Society is not responsible for lost or stolen items.

be respectful - Public drunkenness does not belong at the festival.

A big part of the Bluegrass scene is jamming and you can expect music and singing to carry on into the wee hours. Please respect the other campers around you and tone down the music and singing if it's getting late.

Open liquor is not permitted outside the beer gardens in the concert area. It is permitted at your campsite in the camping area.

There is a designated area in the concert area for smoking, including tobacco, vaping,

and cannabis.

Well behaved, unobtrusive dogs may camp here with you. There are no off leash areas in the festival grounds.

Dogs must be kept at your campsite - you may not bring

your dog to the concert area.
