



# Rainey Center Freedom Project: LA-05

This poll surveyed 889 likely voters via text message from April 4, 2026 to April 7, 2026. Results were weighted by gender, age, race, education, and geography to match population demographics. The margin of error is ±3.6 percentage points at the 95% confidence level.
