and delighting in the human race.”



Ushers will direct you to the front of the church or will notify the communion ministers to bring communion to you if you find walking or climbing the stairs difficult. If you do not wish to receive the wine – or if you only wish to receive a blessing from the priest – please come forward with arms crossed.

Children are especially welcome in our midst. Kids from age 4 to fifth grade are welcome at Children's Church during each Sunday's 10:15 a.m. service – they rejoin their families during The Peace, about midway through worship – or they are just as welcome to stay with their family the entire time. Nursery is available for children under 4 during the 10:15 a.m. service. There are crayons and coloring materials available at each entrance to the worship area.
