
Three Questions We All Face About Jesus.

Sept. 20th & 21st, 2025



Read John 1:19-51.

- 1. Read **John 1:19–28**. What sticks out to you about how John answers the Jewish leaders? Why do you think he's so guick to say who he isn't?
- 2. In **verse 23** John quotes **Isaiah 40:3**. How does that prophecy connect to what John's doing out in the wilderness?
- 3. John calls Jesus "the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world". What do you think that means? How do **Exodus 12** and **Isaiah 53** help us get the picture?
- 4. John's whole life was about preparing people to meet Jesus. How can our lives do the same? What gets in the way of that for you?

- 5. Twice John says, "I didn't know him" (vv.31, 33). What do you think he meant by that? What does it tell us about how people actually come to see Jesus for who he is?
- 6. Jesus isn't just a good example, he's the Savior who takes away sin. Why is that important? How might that change how you deal with struggles, guilt, or just daily stuff?

7. Reread **John 1:35–42**. Andrew meets Jesus and then goes and gets his brother. What do you notice about that? What does it show us about sharing faith in real life?

8. Philip tells Nathanael, "Come and see." What does that teach us? Is there someone in your life who needs that kind of simple invite right now?

- 9. Nathanael is skeptical ("Nazareth?! really?") but ends up saying "You are the Son of God." What do you think made the difference for him? How could God use your story like that for someone else?
- 10. After looking at this passage as a whole, what's one thing about Jesus that really stands out to you? And what's one way you could respond to that this week?
