Read John 5:16-47.

1. What actions & statements of Jesus led the Jewish leaders to begin persecuting Him?
2. What does Jesus mean when He says, "The Son can do nothing by Himself" (**v.19**)? How does this shape our understanding of His relationship with the Father?
3. How can we practice the kind of dependence Jesus models when He says He only does what the Father does?
4. In **verse 24**, what does it mean to have "crossed over from death to life"? Is Jesus speaking of a present reality or a future one?
5. When Jesus speaks of the coming resurrection and judgment (**vv. 28-29**), how should that shape our priorities and hope?
6. Why does Jesus emphasize having multiple witnesses to His identity? What does that teach about how God reveals truth?
7. What does Jesus say about John the Baptist's role in **verses 33-35**? How does He describe John?
8. Jesus rebukes the religious leaders for missing Him even though they knew Scripture. How can we ensure our Bible reading leads to transformation, not just information?
9. How does the desire for human approval (**vv. 41-44**) prevent people from believing in Jesus?
10. Moses' writings pointed forward to Christ (**Gen. 3:15, Num 21:4-9, Deut 18:15**). How can recognizing that all of Scripture centers on Jesus change the way you read the Old Testament?
