

The Great Shepherd and The True Sheep.

Read John 10:22-30.

1. This takes place during the feast of Dedication (Hannukah is Hebrew for dedication). What is the significance of this conversation surrounding a holiday that commemorates cleansing, restoration of true temple worship and military victory? What are some significant Hannukah (moments of dedication) moments you have had in your life when you dedicated or rededicated something to the Lord?

2. Have there been moments where you can relate to the "tell us plainly" line from the Jewish leaders? What felt cryptic or needing further explanation to you from the Lord? How do you personally listen for His voice and follow Jesus in seasons like these?

3. Many of us go through seasons of doubt, dryness or numbness to the Lord and will sometimes doubt our salvation. Think about one of those times and how God might have been holding you in that season. What does it mean to be held by the Son and the Father' hands? What is our role in being held?

Read John 10:31-42.

4. What works is Jesus referring to in earlier sections of **John** that are from the Father? What do each of them signify towards who Jesus is from the Father? Consider **John 2:1-12; 4:46-54; 5:1-9; 6:1-20**. What does he mean by believe the works even though you do not believe me in **verse 38**?

5. Read **Psalm 82**. Some scholars see this text as referring to human leaders while others see it as referring to angelic beings often called sons of God or sons of the Most High. What is Jesus' point in referencing this psalm about him being called the Son of God?

6. Read **John 3:22-36** and refresh yourself on what John the Baptist said of Christ. What is the truth that many saw in John's words from this moment?

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7. Where are you seeing God work or perhaps struggling to see God's Works in your life right now?
