Read John 13.

1. What would you do if you found out that you had less than 24 hours to live? Who would you spend time with?
2. Throughout the book of John, the hour of Jesus is referenced. We see it in **John 2:4** at the first miracle, in **John 7:30** and **8:20** as to why they were not able to seize Jesus and in **chapter 12** Jesus acknowledges that now is the time. What is the hour that Jesus is referring to?
3. What 2 things was Jesus aware of as he faced his last night before the cross? How does that understanding help Jesus face what he is about to go through? (**Hebrews 12:2**)
4. What is the significance of Satan's power in tempting Judas to betray Jesus in **verse 2** and what Jesus understands in **verse 3**? What does **Matthew 28:18** and **Colossians 1:16-18** say about Jesus' authority?

5. If we believe what **verse 3** says that all things are under Jesus' power, what is there to be afraid of? How does this shape the way in which we navigate through life?
6. What does the act of Jesus cleansing the disciples' feet signify? What does Jesus washing Judas' feet demonstrate?
7. Imagine the worst job or task that you ever had, the one that no one wanted to do. Now imagine Jesus humbly and willingly taking that task on. How would that impact you? How did the disciples react to Jesus stooping down to wash their feet?
8. It's humbling to see Jesus, worthy of all our praise, humbling himself to serve in such a way. Yet his humble service was not only demonstrated in foot washing, it was a characteristic of him. What does **Philippians 2:3-8** say about the nature of Jesus' service and how are we to do likewise?
9. How does Jesus' conversation with Judas reveal that Jesus was not simply a victim of circumstances but still in control?
10. What is the evidence that we are disciples of Jesus according to **verse 35**? What is the gauge by which we understand if we are doing that well?
