

Jesus Our Hope.

Read John 14:1-14.

1. In **John 14:1** Jesus tells His disciples, "Do not let your hearts be troubled!" What has been troubling your heart lately?
2. Try applying the Good News (gospel) about Jesus to that specific situation. How can belief/trust in Jesus be antidote to your troubled heart?
3. Jesus comforts His disciples by telling them He's going to prepare a place for them with the Father and He will return later to take them to be with Him! Make a list of what you have to look forward to in Heaven or The New Creation (**Rev 21-22**). What do you look forward to *the most*?
4. In **John 14:6**, Jesus says that no one comes to the Father except through Him. We live in a culture that says there are many paths to God. How do you personally wrestle with Jesus' claim to be the only way and what it means for those you love who don't know Him?

5. Throughout the book of **John**, we see that Jesus fully reveals God the Father. When you imagine what God is like, what is your mental image? Is it shaped by scripture or some ideas from outside scripture?

6. Make a list of some descriptors of Jesus that are also true of God the Father! Let that list shape your mental conception of God!

7. Jesus seems to say in **v.12-14** that Christians will have all of their prayers answered, "yes!" How do you understand His statement given the fact that we DO NOT get everything we ask for in prayer?

8. Look up the following passages and reflect on how they complement this wonderful truth that Jesus hears and answers prayers. If discussing with your Life Group, consider asking what passage stood out or shed some light on prayer.

James 4:2-3

1 John 5:14-15

Luke 22:42

2 Corinthians 12:7-9

Ephesians 3:20

9. What does it mean to ask for something "in Jesus' name" (**v.13-14**)? What are some things it does not mean?

10. Think about your recent prayers. Are they aligned with Jesus' mission and glory? Where might God be inviting you to pray more boldly or more humbly?
