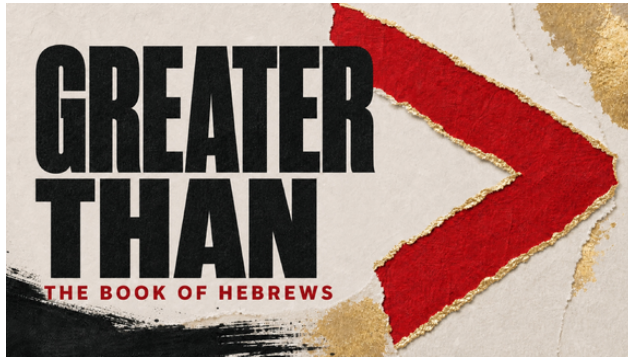


Greater Than Spiritual Beings.

Sept. 19th & 20th, 2026



Read Hebrews 1:5-2:4.

1. **Hebrews 1:5-2:4** emphasizes Jesus' superiority over all spiritual beings. What experience (if any) do you have with the spiritual realm? How much or how little time do you spend thinking about angels or demons?

2. In order to demonstrate Jesus is greater than the angels, Hebrews quotes (at least) seven Old Testament passages. When you see a New Testament author doing that, the best practice is to go and look at that entire verse, read it in context, and try to understand how the New Testament author is using those verses.

Look up the following passages, jot down what you think they mean in their original context, then write down the point Hebrews is making from that passage:

Psalms 2:7

2 Samuel 7:14

Deuteronomy 32:43

Psalms 104:4

Psalms 45:6-7

Psalms 102:25-27

Psalms 110:1

3. In **2:1-4**, the author gives us the reason we should care that Jesus is greater than the angels. What are those reasons?

4. What do you think it looks like today to “pay attention” to Jesus? What are some things that compete for our attention?

5. **Hebrews 2:1** contains the first of many warnings in this book not to drift/fall away from Jesus. Have you seen people drift away from Jesus in your life? What does that look like?

6. What kind of habits/practices are you putting in place now to ensure you do not drift from Jesus?

7. Many Christians have concluded that scripture teaches that genuine believers cannot actually lose their salvation. What do you think about that? What other parts of scripture inform your opinion on that issue?

8. If it is the case that genuine believers cannot lose their salvation, how should we understand a warning passage like this?
