

ి Day 1: Arrival in Lima, Peru

• Morning: Arrival in Lima. Private transfer: 45 min to hotel in

Miraflores or Barranco.

- Afternoon: Settle in, then enjoy a guided stroll through the bohemian
 Barranco district, famed for its street art and cafés.
- Evening: Welcome dinner at a top Peruvian restaurant, sampling contemporary Andean cuisine.
- **Highlight:** Sunset views over the Pacific from the Miraflores cliffs.
- Hotel options:
 - Hotel B (luxury boutique, Barranco) Art-filled mansion with creative flair, from €320/night.
 - Belmond Miraflores Park (luxury, Miraflores) Rooftop pool and ocean views, from €400/night.
 - Atemporal (boutique, Miraflores) Chic, intimate townhouse,
 from €250/night.

TIP: Lima's culinary scene is world-renowned—consider a chef-led market tour or pisco sour masterclass.

© Day 2: Lima - Cusco - Sacred Valley

- Morning: Early flight to Cusco (1h 20m). Private transfer: 1.5h to Sacred Valley, with stops at Awanacancha (Andean camelids) and Pisac market.
- Afternoon: Check in and relax at your valley lodge. Optional gentle walk or spa session to acclimatize.
- **Evening:** Farm-to-table dinner featuring local produce.

Highlight: Meet local artisans and alpacas at Awanacancha.

Hotel options:

- Inkaterra Hacienda Urubamba (luxury eco-lodge, Urubamba) –
 Andean chic with panoramic views, from €350/night.
- Sol y Luna (boutique, Urubamba) Casitas set in lush gardens,
 Relais & Châteaux, from €320/night.
- Explora Valle Sagrado (luxury adventure lodge, near
 Ollantaytambo) All-inclusive explorations, from €500/night.

ALTITUDE: Sacred Valley is at 2,800 m. Rest, hydrate, and avoid strenuous activity on arrival.

TIP: Ask your guide about coca tea and light meals to ease acclimatization.

2 Day 3: Sacred Valley - Machu Picchu

- Morning: Private transfer: 30 min to Ollantaytambo. Vistadome train to Aguas Calientes (1h 45m). Bus up to Machu Picchu (30 min).
- Afternoon: Guided exploration of Machu Picchu citadel. Return to Aguas Calientes for overnight.
- **Evening:** Relax at your hotel or enjoy the thermal baths.
- Highlight: Private tour of Machu Picchu with expert guide—avoid crowds with early entry.

• Hotel options:

Inkaterra Machu Picchu Pueblo (eco-luxury, Aguas Calientes) –
 Lush gardens, birdwatching, from €350/night.

- Sumaq Machu Picchu (luxury, riverside) Gourmet Peruvian cuisine, from €320/night.
- El MaPi by Inkaterra (boutique, central) Modern comfort, from €220/night.

ALTITUDE: Machu Picchu (2,430 m) is lower than Cusco, but take it easy if you feel the effects of altitude.

TIP: Bring your passport for Machu Picchu entry stamp—a unique souvenir!

್ರಿ Day 4: Machu Picchu – Cusco

- Morning: Optional second visit to Machu Picchu (Huayna Picchu or Sun Gate hike, advance permit required). Vistadome train back to Ollantaytambo, then private transfer: 2h to Cusco.
- Afternoon: Settle into your Cusco hotel. Guided walk through the historic center: Plaza de Armas, Qorikancha, San Blas.
- Evening: Dinner at a top local restaurant with Andean fusion cuisine.
- Highlight: Discovering Cusco's Inca and colonial heritage with a private guide.

Hotel options:

- Belmond Palacio Nazarenas (luxury, historic center) Restored convent with heated pool, from €500/night.
- Inkaterra La Casona (luxury boutique, Plaza de Armas) –
 Colonial mansion, from €420/night.

 El Mercado (boutique, San Pedro) – Contemporary style, from €180/night.

ALTITUDE: Cusco is at 3,400 m. Limit alcohol, stay hydrated, and rest if needed.

TIP: San Blas is known for artisan workshops—perfect for unique souvenirs.

ී Day 5: Cusco – Buenos Aires, Argentina

- Morning: Private transfer: 20 min to Cusco airport. Flight to Buenos
 Aires (via Lima, ~7h total incl. layover).
- Afternoon: Arrival in Buenos Aires. Private transfer: 45 min to hotel in Recoleta or Palermo.
- **Evening:** Evening at leisure or optional tango show with dinner.
- Highlight: First taste of Buenos Aires' vibrant nightlife and café culture.

Hotel options:

- Alvear Palace Hotel (luxury, Recoleta) Belle Époque grandeur,
 from €400/night.
- Legado Mítico (boutique, Palermo Soho) Themed suites,
 literary vibe, from €220/night.
- Home Hotel (boutique, Palermo Hollywood) Design-forward,
 lush gardens, from €180/night.

TIP: Palermo is ideal for trendy bars and independent shops; Recoleta for

classic elegance and museums.

Day 6: Buenos Aires – Pampas Experience

- Morning: Private transfer: 1.5h to an authentic estancia (ranch) in the
 Pampas. Horseback riding, asado lunch, and gaucho traditions.
- Afternoon: Return to Buenos Aires. Free time for shopping or art galleries.
- Evening: Optional private tango lesson or rooftop cocktail in Palermo.
- Highlight: Immersive day with local gauchos—learn about Argentina's rural heritage.
- Hotel options: Same hotel options as Day 5.

TIP: Bring sun protection and comfortable shoes for the estancia visit.

9 Day 7: Buenos Aires – El Calafate (Patagonia)

- Morning: Private transfer: 45 min to airport. Flight to El Calafate
 (~3h). Private transfer: 30 min to hotel.
- Afternoon: Explore the town or visit the Glaciarium Ice Museum.
- Evening: Dinner with Patagonian lamb specialties.
- Highlight: First glimpse of the Patagonian steppe and Lago Argentino.

Hotel options:

 EOLO Patagonia Spirit (luxury lodge, steppe) – Panoramic wilderness views, from €600/night.

- Los Sauces Casa Patagónica (boutique, El Calafate) Elegant, tranquil gardens, from €350/night.
- Esplendor by Wyndham (boutique, central) Modern comfort,
 from €180/night.

TIP: Weather in Patagonia is changeable—pack layers and windproof gear.

್ರಿ Day 8: Perito Moreno Glacier

- Morning: Private transfer: 1.5h to Los Glaciares National Park. Guided walkways tour and optional mini-trekking on the glacier.
- Afternoon: Boat ride for close-up glacier views. Return to El Calafate.
- **Evening:** Free time or fireside drinks at your lodge.
- Highlight: Witnessing the thunderous calving of Perito Moreno Glacier.
- Hotel options: Same hotel options as Day 7.

TIP: Book glacier trekking in advance—places are limited and weather-dependent.

್ರಿ Day 9: El Calafate – Torres del Paine, Chile

- Morning: Private 4×4 transfer: 5h (with border formalities and scenic stops) to Torres del Paine National Park.
- Afternoon: Settle into your lodge. Guided introduction walk or wildlife spotting.
- Evening: Dinner with local Patagonian flavors.

• **Highlight:** First views of the Paine Massif and turquoise lakes.

Hotel options:

- Explora Patagonia (luxury adventure lodge, park interior) –
 All-inclusive explorations, from €900/night.
- Awasi Patagonia (ultra-luxury, private villas) Tailored excursions, from €1,200/night.
- Hotel Lago Grey (boutique, park edge) Glacier views, from
 €350/night.

TIP: Chilean border crossings require passport and PDI form—keep documents handy.

9 Day 10: Torres del Paine National Park

- Morning: Guided hike to the base of the Towers or scenic drive to Lago Pehoé (activity tailored to fitness and weather).
- Afternoon: Wildlife safari: guanacos, condors, and foxes. Optional horseback ride with local baqueanos.
- Evening: Stargazing or fireside storytelling at the lodge.
- **Highlight:** Iconic granite spires and wild Patagonian landscapes.
- Hotel options: Same hotel options as Day 9.

TIP: Weather can shift rapidly—carry a waterproof jacket and hat on all excursions.

Day 11: Torres del Paine – Punta Arenas – Departure

- **Morning:** Private transfer: 5h to Punta Arenas airport. Optional stop at a Patagonian estancia or penguin colony (seasonal, add 2h).
- Afternoon: Flight to Santiago or onward destination.
- Evening: —
- Highlight: Farewell to Patagonia's endless skies and wild beauty.
- Hotel options: Day use at a boutique hotel in Punta Arenas possible, depending on flight schedule.

TIP: Allow buffer time for possible weather delays in Patagonia.

* Customizable Options

- Private helicopter over the Sacred Valley or Torres del Paine (weather permitting).
- Cooking class with a Peruvian or Argentine chef—learn ceviche or empanadas.
- Glacier kayaking or ice trekking in Patagonia (seasonal).
- Wine tasting in Mendoza or Colchagua Valley (add-on).
- Extend to the Atacama Desert or Iguazu Falls for more natural wonders.
- Upgrade to ultra-luxury lodges or request a private naturalist guide throughout.

* Practical Info & Budget

- Comfort: Boutique and luxury lodges throughout; expect personalized service, gourmet cuisine, and immersive local design.
- Indicative budget: Accommodation (€180–€1,200/night), private transfers, internal flights, expert guides, most meals, and curated activities included. International flights, some optional excursions, and personal expenses are excluded.
- Budget note: High season and remote locations (Patagonia, Machu Picchu) drive up costs; early booking ensures best rates and availability.
- Seasonal cautions: Weather in the Andes and Patagonia is unpredictable—flexibility and layered clothing are essential. Some activities may be weather-dependent.
- Luggage tips: Soft, weather-resistant bags are recommended. Bring layers, sun protection, and sturdy footwear.
- Included: Accommodation, all private transfers, guided activities, most meals, entrance fees.
- Excluded: International flights, travel insurance, some optional excursions, personal expenses, tips.
