Week 1: Lisbon & Surroundings (Aug 1–7)

- **Day 1: Arrival in Lisbon**



- Morning: Arrival at Lisbon Airport. Private transfer to hotel (30 min).
- Afternoon: Settle in, stroll through Baixa/Chiado. Light sightseeing (stroller-friendly).
- Evening: Early family dinner in the Alfama district.
- Highlight: Welcome pastel de nata at a local bakery.

Accommodation Options:

- **Areias do Seixo** (eco-retreat) – Santa Cruz, 1 hour north of Lisbon. Family-focused, organic farm-to-table dining, daily kids' activities, pools, spa. From €185–250/night.
- **Noah Surf House** (eco beach hotel) – Santa Cruz. Modern, sustainable, surf/yoga, beach cleanups, family rooms. From €185+/night.
- **Martinhal Lisbon Chiado Family Suites** (family-focused suites) – Central Lisbon. Urban comfort, kids' club, ideal for city stays. From €180/night.
- **Casa do Valle** (eco guesthouse) – Sintra. Boho-chic, nature-rich, ideal for Sintra day trips. From €80–150/night.

TIP: Areias do Seixo and Noah Surf House offer a free shuttle between properties and immersive eco-activities for all ages.

- **Day 2: Lisbon's Classics**



- Morning: Tram 28 ride (fun for kids, ages 4+), visit Castelo de São Jorge.

Historic tram through Lisbon's neighborhoods; castle with panoramic views. 2–3 hours. €10–15/person.

- Afternoon: Oceanário de Lisboa (Europe's largest aquarium, all ages, 2–3h visit).

€20–25/person.

- Evening: Dinner at Time Out Market (variety for all tastes).
- Highlight: Sunset over the Tagus River.

TIP: Lisbon's trams and metro are stroller-friendly. Book Oceanário

tickets online to skip the line.

- **Day 3: Sintra Day Trip**



- Morning: Private transfer to Sintra (40 min). Visit Pena Palace (fairytale castle, kids love the gardens).
- Afternoon: Quinta da Regaleira (magical tunnels and towers).
Full day. €50–80/person (guide optional).
- Evening: Return to Lisbon.
- Highlight: Exploring Sintra's mystical forests.

TIP: Stay at Casa do Valle in Sintra for a nature-rich, eco-friendly base close to the palaces.

- **Day 4: Belém & Riverfront**



- Morning: Jerónimos Monastery, Belém Tower (short walks, stroller-friendly).
 - Afternoon: MAAT museum (interactive exhibits for kids), riverside cycle path (bike rentals with child seats).
- 2–3 hours. €15–20/person.*

- Evening: Ice cream by the river.
- Highlight: Tasting authentic pastéis de Belém.

TIP: Bike rentals with child seats are widely available along the Belém riverfront.

- **Day 5: Family Beach Day (Costa da Caparica)**



- Morning: Transfer to Costa da Caparica (30 min). Relax on sandy, lifeguarded beaches.
- Afternoon: Surf lesson (from 6 years, optional), beach games.

Surf lesson: €40–60/person.

- Evening: Seafood dinner overlooking the ocean.
- Highlight: First Atlantic swim!

TIP: Noah Surf House offers surf lessons and beach clean-up activities for families.

- **Day 6: Free/Rest Day**



- Flexible: Pool time, light local walks, or optional visit to Lisbon Zoo.

- Highlight: Slow morning, family games.

TIP: Areias do Seixo hosts weekly BBQs with fresh, on-site grown food and kids' activities.

- **Day 7: Transition to Algarve**



- Morning: Check-out, private transfer or train to Algarve (approx. 3h drive or 3.5h train).
- Afternoon: Arrive in Lagos or Albufeira. Settle into hotel.
- Evening: Stroll in old town, gelato stop.
- Highlight: Welcome to the Algarve coast!

Accommodation Options:

- **Casa Flor de Sal** (eco-farm cottages) – Ria Formosa, Eastern Algarve. 8 self-catering cottages, pools, play areas, wildlife, near barrier islands. From €95–150/night.
- **Conversas de Alpendre** (eco-retreat) – Cacela Velha. 12 rooms, treehouse, saltwater pool, rustic luxury. From €129–180/night.
- **Companhia das Culturas** (eco country hotel) – Silves. Boutique, nature-focused, authentic Algarve. From €140–200/night.
- **Quinta do Freixo** (eco-farmstay) – Loulé. 15 rooms/apartments, 700 hectares of nature, lakes, and springs. From €86–130/night.

TIP: Transfer from Lisbon to Algarve: 3 hours by car or 3.5 hours by train. All local transfers in Algarve under 1 hour.

 Week 2: Algarve Coast (Aug 8–14)

- **Day 8: Lagos Old Town & Beaches**



- Morning: Explore Lagos' cobbled streets, visit Forte da Ponta da Bandeira.
3-4 hours. €5-10/person.
- Afternoon: Praia Dona Ana (gentle waves, family-friendly).
- Evening: Dinner at a local taverna.
- Highlight: Cliffside sunset.

TIP: Casa Flor de Sal and Conversas de Alpendre offer self-catering, reducing meal costs for families.

- **Day 9: Kayak/Grotto Tour**



- Morning: Family kayak tour to Ponta da Piedade caves (from 6 years, 2h, life jackets provided).
€40–60/person.
- Afternoon: Pool or beach relaxation.
- Evening: Seafood dinner in Lagos.
- Highlight: Exploring sea caves by kayak.

TIP: Book kayak or boat tours in advance during August for best time

slots.

- **Day 10: Slide & Splash Waterpark**



- Full day: Slide & Splash (one of Europe's best waterparks, all ages, shaded areas).
€25–35/person.
- Evening: Light dinner, early night.
- Highlight: Family water fun!

TIP: Slide & Splash has shaded picnic areas and lockers for family

convenience.

- **Day 11: Sagres & West Coast**



- Morning: Drive to Sagres (40 min). Visit Fortaleza de Sagres.
Half/full day. €10–20/person.
- Afternoon: Wild beaches of Costa Vicentina (surfing, tide pools).

- Evening: Return to Lagos.
- Highlight: Dramatic Atlantic cliffs.

TIP: Quinta do Freixo's vast grounds are perfect for family nature walks and wildlife spotting.

- **Day 12: Free/Rest Day**



- Flexible: Hotel pool, local markets, or mini-golf.
- Highlight: Family downtime.

TIP: Visit a local market or enjoy a picnic in your eco-lodge's gardens.

- **Day 13: Benagil Caves Excursion**



- Morning: Boat tour to Benagil caves (safe for kids, 2h).
€35–50/person.
- Afternoon: Praia da Marinha (top-rated family beach).
- Evening: Dinner in Carvoeiro.

- Highlight: Iconic sea cave photos.

TIP: Praia da Marinha is free and has calm waters—ideal for young children.

- **Day 14: Transition to Porto Region**

Accommodation Options:

- **Casa Agricola da Levada Eco Village** (eco-village) – Douro Valley, near Peso da Régua. 17th-century granite building, river access, family apartments. From €80–120/night.
- **Quinta da Gricha Vineyard House** (vineyard stay) – Douro Valley. Family comfort, vineyard setting, grape juice tastings. From €100–150/night.
- **Gallery Hostel Porto** (boutique hostel) – Porto city. Family rooms, artsy vibe, central location. From €90–130/night.

TIP: Algarve to Porto: 1 hour flight from Faro + 30 min transfer. All local transfers in Porto/Douro under 1 hour.

 Week 3: Porto & Douro Valley (Aug 15–23)

- **Day 15: Porto City Highlights**



- Morning: Livraria Lello (magical bookstore), Clerigos Tower (panoramic views, ages 6+).
2-3 hours. €15-20/person.
- Afternoon: World of Discoveries (interactive museum, great for kids).
2-3 hours. €12-18/person.
- Evening: Dinner by the Douro River.
- Highlight: Porto's colorful streets.

TIP: Gallery Hostel Porto offers family rooms and a central base for

exploring Porto's highlights.

- **Day 16: Douro Valley Day Trip**



- Morning: Scenic train or private transfer to Peso da Régua (2h).
Vineyard visit (many welcome families, grape juice tastings for kids).
Full day. €60–100/person.
- Afternoon: Douro River cruise (1–2h, gentle pace).
€25–40/person.

- Evening: Return to Porto.
- Highlight: Cruising among vineyards.

TIP: Casa Agricola da Levada Eco Village and Quinta da Gricha offer immersive Douro countryside stays.

- **Day 17: Matosinhos Beach & Aquarium**



- Morning: Tram to Matosinhos (30 min). Oceanário do Porto (smaller aquarium, all ages).
Half/full day. €15–25/person.

- Afternoon: Beach time, surf lesson (from 6 years).
- Evening: Seafood dinner (Matosinhos is famous for grilled fish).
- Highlight: Beach day near Porto.

TIP: Many Porto eco-lodges provide bike rentals with child seats for easy city and beach access.

- **Day 18: Guimarães Medieval Town**



- Morning: Train to Guimarães (1h). Explore castle and old town (UNESCO site, easy walks).

Full day. €30–50/person (guide optional).

- Afternoon: Picnic in city park, return to Porto.
- Evening: Free evening.
- Highlight: Knights and castles adventure.

TIP: Guimarães is stroller-friendly and offers plenty of shaded parks for family picnics.

- **Day 19: Free/Rest Day**



- Flexible: Pool, shopping, or Douro riverside cycle path.

- Highlight: Leisurely family time.

TIP: Many eco-lodges in Douro Valley have pools and gardens for relaxed family downtime.

- **Day 20: Family Farewell in Porto**
