Custom Program – Day-by-Day Itinerary

(August 1–23, 2026)

 **Day 1: Arrival in Lisbon**



-

Morning: Arrival at Lisbon Airport. Private transfer to your hotel in central Lisbon (Baixa/Chiado or Alfama).

- **Afternoon:** Settle in, stroll through the historic center, and enjoy a welcome gelato at Praça do Comércio.
- **Evening:** Family dinner at a traditional Portuguese restaurant (kid-friendly options).
- **Highlight:** First sunset over the Tagus River.

Accommodation Options:

- **Aerias de Seixo** (eco-retreat) – Santa Cruz, 1 hour north of Lisbon. Organic farm-to-table dining, round pools, daily kids' activities, yoga for adults. From €150–200/night (family townhouses).
 - **Canto de Luz** (boutique B&B) – Porto's historic center (also suitable for day trips)

from Lisbon). Heated saltwater pool, lush garden, organic breakfasts. From €180/night.

- **Lisboa Pessoa Hotel** (boutique, family suites) – Central Lisbon.
- **My Story Hotel Tejo** (budget, central) – Lisbon.
- **Local guesthouse in Alfama** – Lisbon's most atmospheric district.

TIP: Aérias de Seixo is ideal for families seeking a working farm experience with both relaxation and entertainment. Canto de Luz offers luxury with deep environmental commitment.

TIP: All hotels proposed have family amenities; eco-lodges use natural ventilation instead of air conditioning.


Day 2: Lisbon – Tramways & Belém



- **Morning:** Ride the famous Tram 28 through historic neighborhoods (stroller-friendly, children love it!).
- **Afternoon:** Visit Belém: Jerónimos Monastery (UNESCO), Pastéis de Belém tasting, and riverside gardens.
- **Evening:** Dinner in Belém or return to city center.
- **Highlight:** Pastel de nata baking workshop (ages 6+, 1.5h, €25–35 pp).

TIP: Tram 28 is a must for families—€6 per adult, €3 per child. Book the Pastel de Nata workshop in advance for a hands-on treat!

📍 **Day 3: Oceanário & Parque das Nações**



-

Morning: Visit the Lisbon Oceanarium—Europe’s largest (all ages, stroller accessible, €20–25/adult, €12–15/child).

- **Afternoon:** Cable car ride and interactive science museum (Pavilhão do Conhecimento).
- **Evening:** Relax by the riverside promenade.
- **Highlight:** Kids’ science workshop (ages 4+).

TIP: The Oceanarium is a highlight for all ages—plan 2–3 hours and arrive early to avoid crowds.

 **Day 4: Sintra – Palaces & Forests**



- **Morning:** Private transfer (40 min) to Sintra. Explore Pena Palace and Park (magical for children, some stairs).
- **Afternoon:** Quinta da Regaleira gardens (mystical tunnels and towers, €15/adult, €8/child).
- **Evening:** Return to Lisbon.
- **Highlight:** Picnic lunch in Sintra's forests.

TIP: Quinta da Regaleira is a magical, hands-on experience for ages 4+; allow 2–3 hours for exploration.

 **Day 5: Beach Day – Costa da Caparica**

Morning: Transfer (30 min) to Costa da Caparica. Family beach time, surf lesson for kids (ages 6+).

- **Afternoon:** Beach picnic or local seafood lunch.
- **Evening:** Return to Lisbon, evening at leisure.
- **Highlight:** Sandcastle competition!

TIP: Plan beach and water activities for early morning or late afternoon to avoid peak heat in August.

 **Day 6: Lisbon – Free Day**

All Day: Rest, pool time, or optional activities: tile painting workshop, local markets, or a scenic ferry ride.

- **Highlight:** Flexible family day—adapted to everyone’s energy.

TIP: Local markets offer fresh produce for self-catering and picnic options.

 **Day 7: Lisbon to Algarve (Lagos)**



- **Morning:** Private transfer or train to Lagos (approx. 3–3.5h drive, 3.5–4h train).
- **Afternoon:** Check-in at your Algarve hotel. Relax by the pool or explore Lagos' old town.
- **Evening:** Dinner at a seaside restaurant.

Accommodation Options:

 - **Casa Flor de Sal** (farm stay) – Eastern Algarve. 8 self-catering cottages, 2 pools, natural lake, play areas, gardens. From €127/night.
 - **Fajã dos Padres** (ecological farm) – Eastern Algarve. Oceanfront cottages, cable car/boat access, on-site restaurant. From €127/night.
 - **Cork Oak Cottage** (off-grid eco-lodge) – Vila do Bispo, Algarve. Solar power, lakes,

zip lines, paddle boards. From €70/night.

- **Casa Mãe Lagos** (boutique, family rooms) – Lagos.
- **Eco Lodge Monte da Casteleja** – Lagos.
- **Guesthouse near Meia Praia** – Lagos.

TIP: Rent a car for flexibility in the Algarve, or use private transfers for stress-free travel with children.

Day 8: Lagos Beaches & Grottos



- **Morning:** Family boat tour to Ponta da Piedade grottos (lifejackets provided, ages 3+, €30–40/adult, €15–20/child).
 - **Afternoon:** Beach time at Praia Dona Ana (gentle waves, lifeguards).
-

- **Evening:** Ice cream on the promenade.
- **Highlight:** Dolphin watching (optional, ages 4+, €35–50 pp).

TIP: Book boat and dolphin tours in advance for August dates.

Day 9: Sagres & Cape St. Vincent



- **Morning:** Excursion to Sagres (40 min drive). Visit the fort and dramatic cliffs.
 - **Afternoon:** Picnic at Cape St. Vincent, short coastal walk (easy, suitable for children, €20–30 transport + €10 entry).

- **Evening:** Return to Lagos, sunset views.

TIP: Cape St. Vincent is Europe's southwestern point—bring a windbreaker for cliff-top breezes.

Day 10: Waterpark Adventure

Day 12: Monchique Mountains

- **Afternoon:** Visit Caldas de Monchique spa village (thermal pools, family-friendly, €10–15 entry).
- **Evening:** Return to Lagos.

TIP: The Monchique region is cooler—perfect for a break from the beach heat.

Day 13: Aljezur & West Coast Beaches



- **Morning:** Day trip to Aljezur (45 min). Explore historic village and wild beaches (Arrifana, Amoreira).
- **Afternoon:** Surf lesson or sand dune play (ages 6+).

 **Day 14: Lagos – Leisure & Farewell Algarve**

 **Day 15: Algarve to Porto (via Lisbon)**



- **Morning:** Transfer to Faro Airport (1h), flight to Porto (1h, direct), or train (6–7h, scenic but long with kids—flight recommended).
- **Afternoon:** Arrival in Porto, transfer to hotel in Ribeira or Cedofeita.

 - **The Yeatman Hotel** (luxury eco-hotel) – Vila Nova de Gaia, Porto. Solar thermal panels, rainwater harvesting, composting, smart controls. From €130–200/night.

- **Canto de Luz** (boutique B&B) – Porto historic center. Heated saltwater pool, organic breakfasts. From €180/night.
- **Moov Hotel Porto Centro** (budget, family rooms) – Porto.
- **PortoBay Flores** (boutique) – Porto.
- **Guesthouse in Foz** – Porto.

TIP: Domestic flights are efficient for long distances with children; allow 2 hours for airport procedures.

📍 Day 16: Porto – City & River



- **Morning:** Guided walking tour (adapted for children, 2h). Visit Livraria Lello (magical bookstore, ages 6+, €5 entry pp).

- **Afternoon:** Douro river cruise (1h, all ages, €15–20/adult, €8–12/child).
- **Evening:** Dinner at a riverside café.
- **Highlight:** Porto tram ride.

TIP: Livraria Lello is popular—book tickets online to avoid queues.

📍 Day 17: Porto – World of Discoveries & Gardens



- **Morning:** Interactive visit to World of Discoveries Museum (ages 4+, hands-on exhibits, €12–15/adult, €8–10/child).
- **Afternoon:** Serralves Park and contemporary art museum (gardens, playground).
- **Evening:** Leisure in Foz district.

TIP: World of Discoveries is a favorite for children—plan 2–3 hours for the museum.

Day 18: Douro Valley Day Trip

Morning: Private transfer (1.5h) to Douro Valley. Visit a wine estate (kid-friendly tours, grape juice tasting, €40–60/adult, €20–30/child).

- **Afternoon:** River picnic, short vineyard walk.
- **Evening:** Return to Porto.

TIP: Many Douro estates offer family discounts and grape juice tastings for children.

Day 19: Porto – Free/Rest Day



- **All Day:** Rest, pool, shopping, or optional cooking class for families.
- **Highlight:** Flexible day for spontaneous discoveries.

TIP: Porto's markets and riverside parks are perfect for a relaxing family day.

📍 **Day 20: Guimarães & Braga**

Morning: Excursion to Guimarães (45 min). Explore the castle and medieval streets (ages 5+, €10–15 entry + €20–30 transport).
