📍 **Day 1: Arrival in Tuscany – Barga**



● **Morning:** Arrive at Pisa or Florence airport (TBD – recommend Pisa)

for proximity). Private transfer (1h30) or rental car to Barga. Early check-in if possible.

- **Afternoon:** Settle into your hotel. Stroll through Barga's medieval center, visit the Duomo di San Cristoforo, and enjoy a coffee in Piazza Angelio.
- **Evening:** Dinner at a local trattoria—try traditional "tordelli lucchese."
- **Highlight:** Sunset views from the Duomo terrace.

Accommodation Options:

- **Residence La Mezzaluna** (budget guesthouse) – Central Barga. Family-run, apartment-style guesthouse with spotless, quirky artistic rooms; emphasizes local hospitality and proximity to medieval sites. From €80-100/night.
- **Villa Gherardi - B&B e Hostel** (historic B&B/hostel) – Barga old town. Locally-owned, beautifully furnished rooms, pet-friendly, and supports regional artisan vibes. From €90-120/night.
- **Agriturismo Il Tiglio** (farm stay) – Garfagnana countryside near Barga. Sustainable farm stay with garden terrace, homegrown produce, and authentic rural immersion. From €70-110/night.

TIP: Choose locally-owned guesthouses or agriturismi for a more authentic and sustainable Tuscan experience.

Transfer: Pisa airport to Barga: ~1h30 by private transfer or rental car.

Day 2: Discover Barga & Garfagnana



- **Morning: Guided walking tour of Barga's history and artisan workshops:** 2-hour stroll through the medieval center, Duomo, and local craftspeople. €20-30/person, 2h.

📍 **Day 3: Lucca or Relax in Barga**



- **Morning:** Option 1: Day trip to Lucca (1h drive). Cycle or walk the Renaissance walls, visit Puccini's birthplace, explore artisan shops.
- **Afternoon:** Lunch in Lucca's Piazza Anfiteatro. Return to Barga by late afternoon.

- **Alternative:** Stay in Barga for a spa session or cooking class (to be arranged).

TIP: The scenic drive from Barga to Arcola via the Apuan Alps is a highlight—consider stopping for photos along the way.

Transfer: Barga to Arcola: ~2h30 by car (scenic route).

📍 **Day 5: Day Trip to Cinque Terre**



● **Morning:** Early drive (15 min) to La Spezia. Take the train to Cinque

Terre villages (Riomaggiore, Manarola, Vernazza, Monterosso).

Explore by train or ferry. Moderate hikes possible (1–3h segments).

Cinque Terre Card: €20-30/person, full day.

- **Evening:** Return to Arcola. Farewell dinner—try local “muscoli ripieni” (stuffed mussels).
- **Highlight:** Boat ride with panoramic coastal views.

Accommodation Options: Same as Day 4.

TIP: Book your boat trip with local operators in Portovenere for a more

sustainable and authentic experience.

Transfer: Arcola to Portovenere: ~40 min by car; Arcola to Lerici: ~30 min by car.

📍 **Day 7: Leisure in Arcola & Departure**



- **Morning:** Leisurely breakfast. Last stroll through Arcola, visit local market if open.
- **Afternoon:** Check out. Transfer to Pisa or Florence airport (TBD, approx. 1h–1h30) for return flight.

- **Evening:** Departure.

TIP: Pisa airport is the most convenient for your return, just 1–1.5h from Arcola by car.

Transfer: Arcola to Pisa airport: ~1–1.5h by car.
