## ✦ Introduction

Welcome, Nathalie! Based on your initial preferences, we have designed a preliminary 25-day journey through Brazil, tailored for three adults seeking authentic experiences. This program is crafted by our senior travel designers, leveraging deep local knowledge to ensure a seamless blend of art, nature, music, local life, handcrafted culture, and Brazil's most beautiful beaches. You requested guesthouses and eco lodges, a moderate budget, and a focus on immersive, non-touristy moments. All logistics, pacing, and accommodations are selected for comfort and authenticity. This is a first draft—fully customizable to your pace and interests.

## ✦ Why Brazil?

- **Art & Handcrafts:** Brazil's cities and villages pulse with creativity, from São Paulo's street art to Bahia's artisan markets.
- **Nature:** Rainforests, waterfalls, and coastal reserves offer world-class biodiversity and eco-lodge experiences.
- **Music & Local Life:** Samba, bossa nova, and forró animate evenings; local hosts share their culture in intimate settings.
- **Beaches:** From the wild beauty of Itacaré to the iconic sands of Paraty and Ilha Grande, Brazil's coastline is unrivaled.

## ✦ Custom Program – 25 Days in Brazil

### 📍 Day 1: Arrival in São Paulo – Urban Art & Welcome



- **Morning:** Arrival at São Paulo (GRU). Private transfer to Vila Madalena, the city's creative heart (1–1.5h, depending on traffic). Early check-in at a boutique guesthouse.
- **Afternoon: Guided Street Art Walk** in Vila Madalena (Beco do Batman): Explore São Paulo's iconic graffiti alley and surrounding

streets with a local artist-guide.

*Duration:* 2–3h. *Price:* €20–30 per person (small group), €60–90 total for private guide.

- **Evening:** Welcome dinner with live bossa nova at a local bar.
- **Highlight:** Immersion in São Paulo's dynamic art scene.
- **Accommodation Options:**
  - **Pousada Zilah** (artistic guesthouse) – Jardins, near Avenida Paulista. Restored house with modernist furniture, Brazilian art, homemade breakfast, small garden. From €70–90 per room/night (~€35–45 pp sharing). Focus on local food, small scale, owner-run.
  - **Guesthouse Vila Madalena** (boutique B&B) – Steps from Beco do Batman. Local artists' work in rooms, regional breakfast, eco-friendly practices. From €50–80 per room/night.
- **[To Customize]:** Level of guided support, dinner style.

**TIP:** São Paulo evenings can be cool in winter; bring a light jacket. Use metro/taxis to reduce time in traffic.

## **Day 2: São Paulo – Museums & Markets**



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**Morning: MASP (Museu de Arte de São Paulo) & Paulista Cultural**

**Walk:** Visit MASP's renowned collection, then stroll Avenida Paulista's cultural centers (IMS, Japan House, Sesc Paulista).

*Duration:* 3–4h. *Price:* €10–15 pp entrance; guided tour €25–40 pp.

- **Afternoon: Mercado Municipal Gourmet & Historic Center Stroll:**

Food tour at Mercado Municipal (pastel de bacalhau, exotic fruits), then walk through Sé, Pátio do Colégio, and historic buildings.

*Duration:* 3h. *Price:* €20–35 pp including tastings.

- **Evening:** Optional: Samba night at a traditional club.

- **Highlight:** Blend of high art and local flavors.

- **Accommodation Options:**

- Same hotel options as Day 1

- **[To Customize]:** Museum preferences, nightlife interest.

**TIP:** All São Paulo experiences are adult-friendly; no age restrictions. Book MASP skip-the-line tickets in advance for weekends.

📍 **Day 3: São Paulo – Local Life & Departure to Paraty**



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**Morning:** Neighborhood market visit, coffee with local artisans.

- **Afternoon:** Private transfer to Paraty (approx. 4.5–5h, scenic coastal route via BR-101, with snack break).

- **Evening:** Settle into a colonial guesthouse in Paraty’s historic center.
- **Highlight:** Arrival in UNESCO-listed Paraty, cobbled streets and colonial charm.
- **Accommodation Options:**
  - **Pousada Literária de Paraty** (boutique guesthouse) – Historic center. Colonial buildings, library, design blending colonial and contemporary art. From €120–180 per room/night (~€45–70 pp sharing triple). Restored heritage, supports local culture.
  - **Pousada do Sandi** (historic guesthouse) – Heart of old town. 18th-century building, tropical gardens, pool, Brazilian décor. From €100–150 per room/night (~€40–60 pp sharing). Locally run, regional produce.
  - **Casa Tambor Eco Lodge** (eco-lodge) – Hills between rainforest and sea, 8km from Paraty. Artistic, ecological bungalows, yoga deck, sea views. From €70–110 per bungalow/night (~€35–55 pp). Solar energy, composting toilets, nature protection.
- **[To Customize]:** Transfer time, stopovers en route.

**TIP:** Cobbled streets in Paraty—bring comfortable walking sandals or trainers.

## **Day 4: Paraty – Artisans & Bay Islands**



- **Morning: Artisans & Cachaça Distillery Tour:** Guided walk through colonial streets visiting ateliers (wood, ceramics, jewelry) and a countryside cachaça distillery.  
*Duration:* 4h. *Price:* €30–45 pp (tastings included; private tour ~€120–150 for 3).
- **Afternoon: Schooner Cruise in Paraty Bay:** Day tour by boat to 3–4 islands and beaches for swimming/snorkeling, seafood lunch on board.  
*Duration:* 5–6h. *Price:* Group: €20–30 pp (excl. lunch); private boat for 3: €250–350 total.

- **Evening:** Free time to explore Paraty's nightlife.
- **Highlight:** Meeting local artists and island hopping.
- **Accommodation Options:**
  - Same hotel options as Day 3
- **[To Customize]:** Private vs. group boat, art focus.

**TIP:** Some eco-lodges like Casa Tambor involve uphill walks and steps—check mobility if needed.

## 📍 **Day 5: Paraty – Waterfalls & Forest Trails**



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**Morning: Jeep Tour – Serra da Bocaina Waterfalls & Rainforest:** 4×4

drive into Atlantic Forest, short walks to waterfalls (like Tobogã), optional natural slides, visit rural communities.

*Duration:* 4–6h. *Price:* €30–50 pp (group), €150–200 private for 3.

- **Afternoon: Community Visit – Quilombo near Paraty:** Visit an Afro-Brazilian community, learn about history, crafts, music, and food.

*Duration:* 3–4h. *Price:* €30–40 pp (includes local guide).

- **Evening:** Dinner at a farm-to-table restaurant.
- **Highlight:** Authentic local encounters and nature immersion.
- **Accommodation Options:**
  - Same hotel options as Day 3
- **[To Customize]:** Hiking difficulty, community visit depth.

**TIP:** Winter (July–August) is drier and cooler—excellent for hiking and boat trips; sea still pleasant.

 **Day 6: Paraty – Free Day / Rest**



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**All Day:** Rest day. Optional: Yoga, spa, beach, or creative workshop (painting, ceramics).

- **Highlight:** Slow morning in a hammock, soaking in Paraty's atmosphere.

- **Accommodation Options:**

- Same hotel options as Day 3

- **[To Customize]:** Activities or pure leisure.

**TIP:** Many guesthouses offer yoga or creative workshops—ask at reception for local options.

## 📍 Day 7: Paraty to Ilha Grande – Island Escape



- **Morning:** Private transfer to Angra dos Reis (2h), then boat to Ilha Grande (fast boat: 20–40 min; regular ferry: 45–90 min).
- **Afternoon:** Settle into an eco-lodge near Abraão village. Beach time.
- **Evening:** Dinner at a beachside restaurant.
- **Highlight:** Arrival on car-free Ilha Grande, wild beaches and rainforest.
- **Accommodation Options:**
  - **Pousada Naturalia** (eco-lodge) – Quiet slope near Vila do

Abraão. Rustic, comfortable rooms with balconies, sea views, surrounded by greenery. From €80–120 per room/night (~€40–60 pp). Solar water heating, local staff, low-impact tourism.

- **Asalem** (eco-lodge) – Secluded bay near Abraão, reached by short boat transfer. Rustic-chic wooden structure, panoramic sea views, solar-powered water heating, rainwater harvesting. From €120–160 per room/night (~€50–75 pp).
- **O Sítio – Ilha Grande** (eco-boutique hotel) – Near Abraãozinho bay, lush gardens, simple but elegant rooms, strong focus on serenity and local vegetation. From €90–130 per room/night (~€45–65 pp). Sustainable tourism, social/environmental awareness.

- **[To Customize]:** Lodge style, boat type.

**TIP:** No cars on Ilha Grande—everything by foot or boat. Pack waterproof bags for electronics; cash is useful for small communities.

## **Day 8: Ilha Grande – Hiking & Hidden Beaches**



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**Morning: Hike to Lopes Mendes Beach:** Classic hike through Atlantic Forest to one of Brazil's most beautiful beaches.

*Duration:* 2.5h each way (moderate), or boat to Praia do Pouso + 20 min walk. *Price:* Local guide €25–40 pp; boat transfer €10–20 pp round trip.

- **Afternoon:** Picnic and swimming at Lopes Mendes.
- **Evening:** Return to lodge, sunset drinks.
- **Highlight:** One of Brazil's most beautiful beaches.

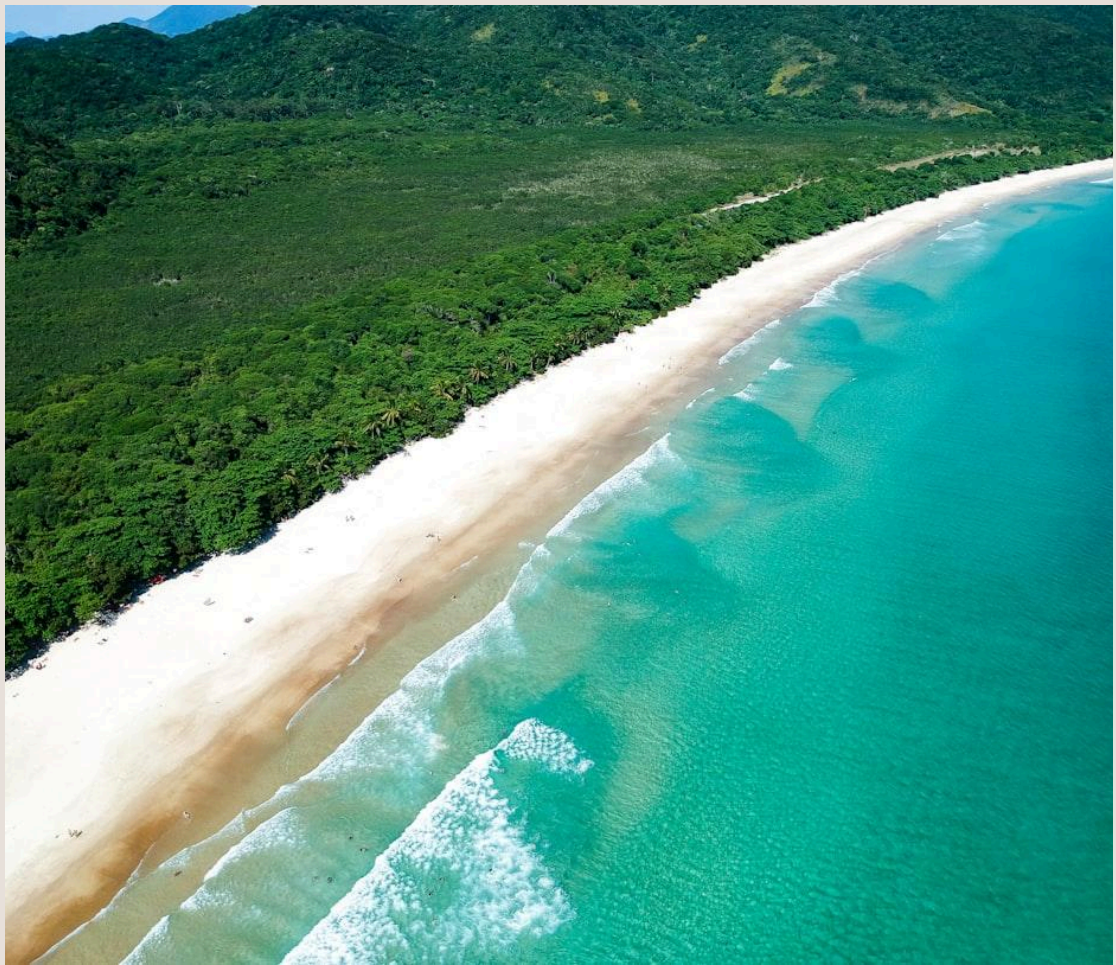

- **[To Customize]:** Hike vs. boat, fitness level.

**TIP:** Atlantic Forest can have showers even in winter—bring a light rain jacket.

📍 **Day 9: Ilha Grande – Kayaking & Local Life**



- **Morning: Sea Kayaking to Secluded Coves:** Guided paddle in calm

waters from Abraão to nearby beaches and forested shoreline; stops for swimming and fruit snacks.

*Duration: 2–3h. Price: €25–40 pp including equipment.*

- **Afternoon: Local Fisherman’s Lunch / Community Visit:** Small-boat trip to a fisherman’s home or tiny community; lunch of fresh fish, conversation about island life.

*Duration: 3–4h. Price: €25–45 pp.*

- **Evening:** Free time in Abraão village.
- **Highlight:** Authentic connection with local islanders.
- **Accommodation Options:**
  - Same hotel options as Day 7
- **[To Customize]:** Activity level, culinary interests.

**TIP:** Direct support to local families—these experiences are non-mass-touristic and highly authentic.

## **Day 10: Ilha Grande – Free Day / Rest**



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**All Day:** Rest day. Optional: Massage, boat trip, snorkeling, or creative workshop.

- **Highlight:** Unstructured time in paradise.

- **Accommodation Options:**

- Same hotel options as Day 7

- **[To Customize]:** Activities or pure leisure.

**TIP:** Many eco-lodges provide filtered water—bring a reusable bottle to reduce plastic waste.

## 📍 Day 11: Ilha Grande to Rio de Janeiro – City of Samba



- **Morning:** Boat from Ilha Grande to mainland (30–60 min), then private transfer to Rio de Janeiro (2.5–3.5h, depending on traffic).
- **Afternoon:** Check-in at a guesthouse in Santa Teresa (artsy hilltop district).
- **Evening:** Samba show in Lapa district.
- **Highlight:** First night in Rio's bohemian quarter.

- **Accommodation Options:**

- **Casa Amarelo by Robert le Héros** (boutique guesthouse) – Santa Teresa hillside. Restored mansion, vintage furniture, leafy garden, small pool. From €110–160 per room/night (~€45–70 pp). Boutique scale, local staff, local food.
- **Mama Ruisa Boutique Hotel** (boutique guesthouse) – Santa Teresa. Mansion with tropical garden and pool, curated art, quiet and adult-friendly. From €140–190 per room/night (~€55–75 pp). Independently run, local guides/suppliers.

- **[To Customize]:** Show style, neighborhood.

**TIP:** Santa Teresa streets are steep—comfortable shoes are important. Use taxis/ride-hailing at night for safety.

 **Day 12: Rio de Janeiro – Art & Beaches**



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**Morning: Art & Street Culture Tour:** Guided visit to Selarón Steps, downtown street murals, and Museu de Arte do Rio (MAR), focusing on urban, Afro-Brazilian, and contemporary art.

*Duration:* 4–5h. *Price:* €35–50 pp (museum ticket included).

- **Afternoon:** Relax on Ipanema or Copacabana beach.

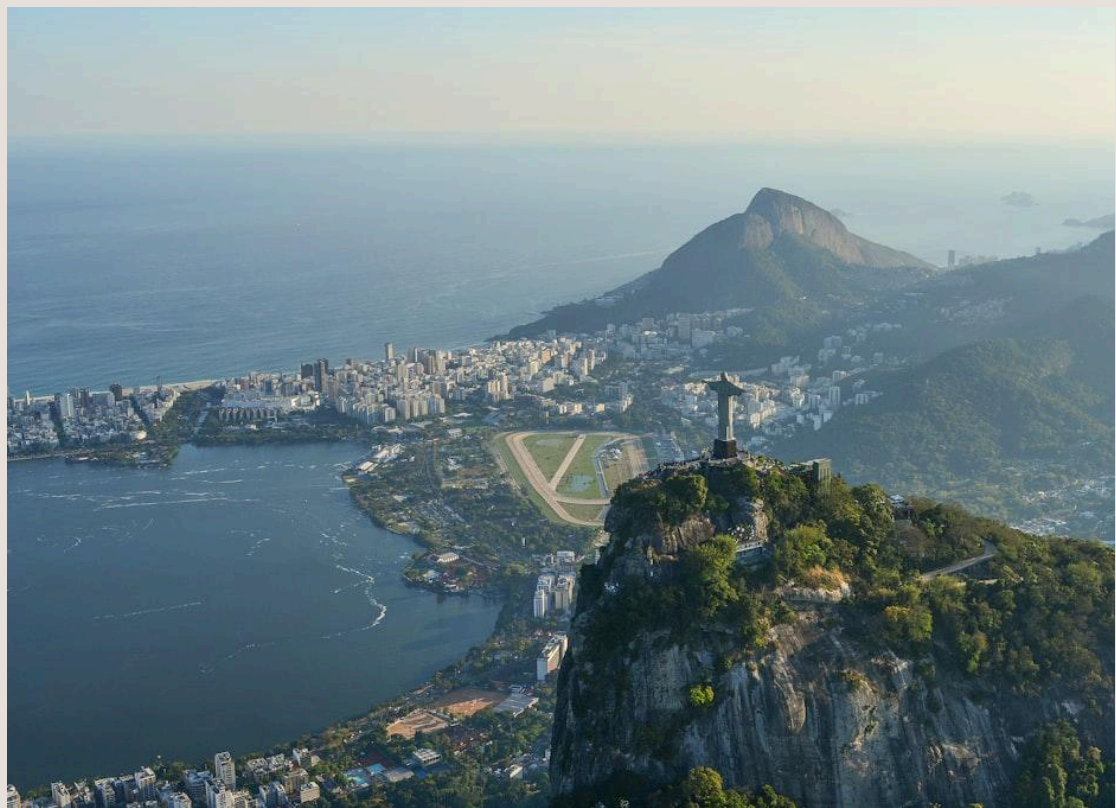
*Cost:* Chairs + umbrella €5–10 pp for the day; metro/taxi €3–10 pp each way.

- **Evening:** Dinner at a local churrascaria.

- **Highlight:** Fusion of urban art and beach culture.

- **[To Customize]:** Museum choices, beach preference.

**TIP:** Book art tours with guides who focus on Afro-Brazilian and contemporary artists for deeper immersion.

### 📍 **Day 13: Rio de Janeiro – Tijuca Forest & Local Markets**



- **Morning: Tijuca National Park Jeep Tour & Short Hikes:** 4×4 tour through the world's largest urban forest, short walks to waterfalls and

viewpoints (Vista Chinesa, Alto da Boa Vista).

*Duration:* 4–6h. *Price:* €40–60 pp (small group), €150–200 private.

- **Afternoon: Local Markets & Music Night:** Feira de São Cristóvão (Nordestino market: crafts, forró music, regional foods), followed by samba or jazz night at a traditional bar.

*Duration:* Market ~3h, evening music flexible. *Price:* Guided visit €25–35 pp; club entry €10–20 pp plus drinks.

- **Evening:** Optional: Jazz night in a local bar.
- **Highlight:** Urban rainforest adventure.
- **Accommodation Options:**
  - Same hotel options as Day 11
- **[To Customize]:** Market selection, music style.

**TIP:** All activities are adult-appropriate; no age restrictions. Use authorized taxis for evening returns.

## **Day 14: Rio de Janeiro – Free Day / Rest**



- **All Day:** Rest day. Optional: Art workshops, spa, or guided favela tour (with reputable local guide).
- **Highlight:** Leisurely day in Rio's creative district.
- **Accommodation Options:**
  - Same hotel options as Day 11
- **[To Customize]:** Activities or pure leisure.

**TIP:** Santa Teresa is ideal for access to both art and nightlife—ask your guesthouse for local art events.

## 📍 Day 15: Rio to Salvador – Afro-Brazilian Culture



- **Morning:** Flight to Salvador (2.5h, with 2h airport buffer). Private transfer from airport to Pelourinho (30–40 min).
- **Afternoon: Pelourinho Walking Tour:** Guided stroll through colonial streets, churches, capoeira rodas, artisan ateliers; stories of Afro-Brazilian history and Candomblé.

*Duration: 3–4h. Price: €25–40 pp.*

- **Evening:** Dinner with live music (samba-reggae).
- **Highlight:** Immersion in Salvador's colorful heritage.
- **Accommodation Options:**
  - **Casa do Amarelindo** (colonial guesthouse) – Pelourinho, balconies overlooking the bay, rooftop terrace with pool, Afro-Brazilian décor. From €90–140 per room/night (~€45–70 pp). Locally staffed, supports neighborhood events.
  - **Hotel Villa Bahia** (boutique guesthouse) – On a picturesque square in Pelourinho. Two restored colonial mansions, patio garden, period furniture. From €120–160 per room/night (~€50–75 pp). Local cultural promotion, Bahia artists/suppliers.
- **[To Customize]:** Flight time, music venues.

**TIP:** At night, stay in main, lively streets of Pelourinho with groups or guides. Use hotel safes for valuables.

## **Day 16: Salvador – Markets & Music**



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**Morning: Mercado Modelo & Artisans of Lower City:** Visit the historic market for handicrafts (wood, lace, leather), local foods; ride Lacerda Elevator between upper and lower city.

*Duration: 2–3h. Price: €15–25 pp (guide optional).*

- **Afternoon: Percussion / Music Workshop:** Hands-on drumming or music session with local musicians (Afro-Brazilian groups).

*Duration: 1.5–2h. Price: €20–40 pp.*

- **Evening: Candomblé Ceremony Visit:** Evening visit to a terreiro

(temple) with explanation of ritual, beliefs, and music.

*Duration:* 3–4h. *Price:* €40–60 pp (includes transport and mediator).

- **Highlight:** Hands-on local music and spiritual culture.
- **Accommodation Options:**
  - Same hotel options as Day 15
- **[To Customize]:** Workshop depth, cultural experiences.

**TIP:** Experiences are adult-appropriate; Candomblé ceremonies require respectful dress and behavior.

## **Day 17: Salvador to Chapada Diamantina – Nature Retreat**



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- **Morning:** Early private transfer to Lençóis (Chapada Diamantina, 5.5h scenic drive, with snack stops).
- **Afternoon:** Settle into an eco-lodge. Orientation walk in Lençóis (colonial town, artisan shops).
- **Evening:** Dinner at the lodge, stargazing.
- **Highlight:** Arrival in Brazil's hiking paradise.
- **Accommodation Options:**
  - **Canto das Águas Hotel** (eco-lodge) – Riverbank at edge of Lençóis. Natural stone, gardens, river views, pool, local art. From €80–130 per room/night (~€40–65 pp). Local materials,

regional tourism, staff from nearby communities.

- **Vila Serrano Pousada** (eco-guesthouse) – Quiet street near Lençóis center. Lush garden, organic breakfast, simple cozy rooms. From €60–100 per room/night (~€30–50 pp). Nature focus, organic produce, small-scale ownership.
- **[To Customize]:** Lodge style, transfer stops.

**TIP:** Pack good hiking shoes, sun protection, and a small daypack. Many eco-lodges accept cash more readily than cards.

## **Day 18: Chapada Diamantina – Waterfalls & Caves**

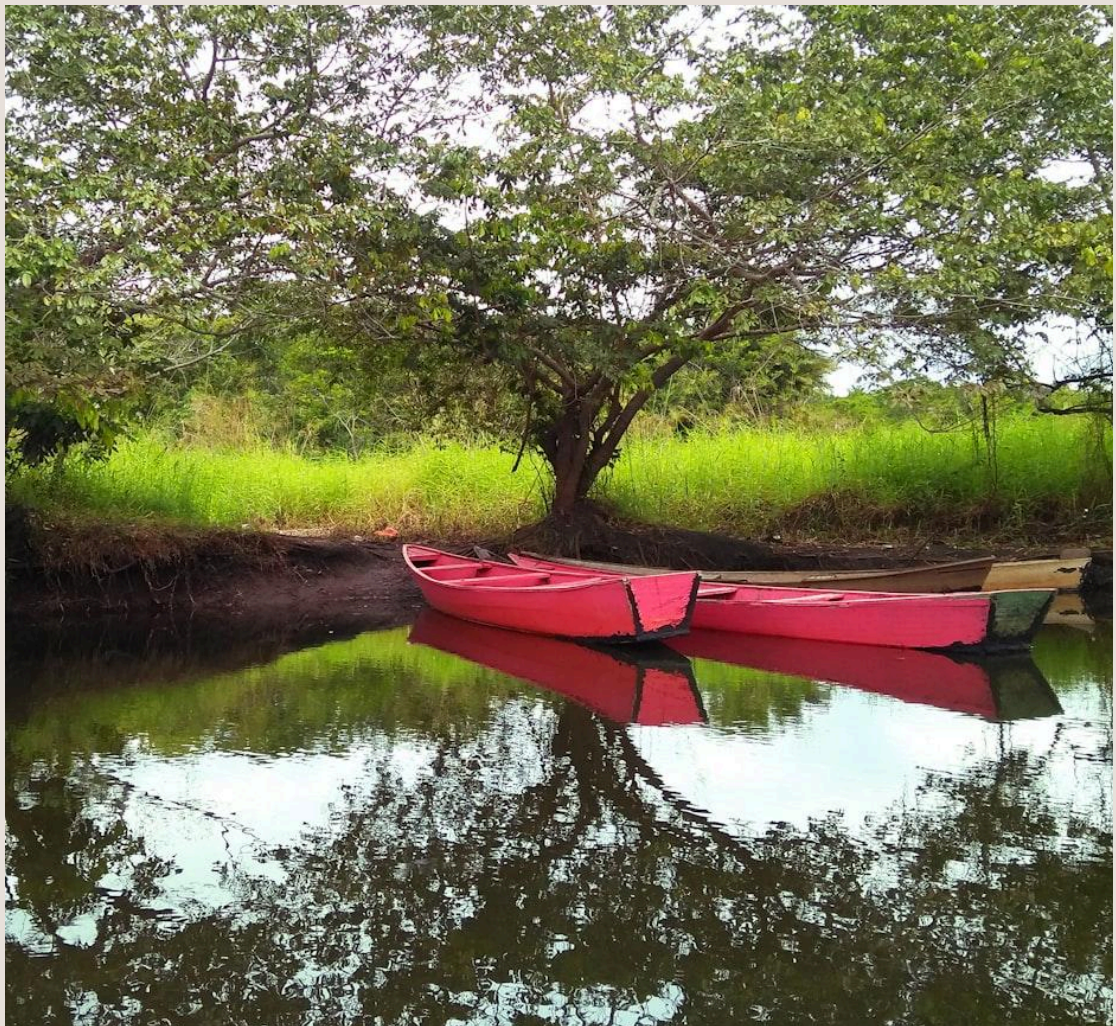


- **Morning: Waterfall Hike – Poço do Diabo or Cachoeira da Fumaça:**  
Guided hike to dramatic waterfall and natural pool; choice of easier (Poço do Diabo) or more demanding (Fumaça).  
*Duration:* 3–6h. *Price:* €25–40 pp (includes transport from Lençóis).
- **Afternoon: Gruta da Lapa Doce & Pratinha / Azul Springs:** Visit limestone cave (easy walk with lighting), swim in clear springs, optional floating.  
*Duration:* Full day (6–8h). *Price:* €30–50 pp (entrances and guide included).
- **Evening:** Local dinner in Lençóis.

- **Highlight:** Spectacular landscapes and adventure.
- **Accommodation Options:**
  - Same hotel options as Day 17
- **[To Customize]:** Hike difficulty, cave interest.

**TIP:** Yellow fever vaccination is recommended for Chapada Diamantina.

### 📍 **Day 19: Chapada Diamantina – Local Life & Rest**



**Morning: Local Farm / Artisan Cooperative Visit:** Visit a small rural farm or cooperative producing honey, crafts, or organic foods; taste products, hear stories of life in the interior.

*Duration:* 3–4h. *Price:* €20–30 pp.

- **Afternoon:** Free time to relax by the river or explore Lençóis at leisure.
- **Evening:** Optional: Cooking class with a local chef.
- **Highlight:** Connection with rural Brazilian life.
- **Accommodation Options:**
  - Same hotel options as Day 17
- **[To Customize]:** Workshop participation, leisure activities.

**TIP:** Many farm visits and cooperatives directly support local communities—choose community-based operators.

## **Day 20: Chapada Diamantina – Panoramas & Waterfalls**



- **Morning: Morro do Pai Inácio Viewpoint:** Short hike (~20–30 min climb) to a mesa with panoramic views over Chapada's table mountains.  
*Duration:* 2–3h including transport. *Price:* €15–25 pp.
- **Afternoon:** Swim at Pratinha or Azul caves (crystal-clear springs).
- **Evening:** Farewell dinner in Lençóis.
- **Highlight:** Unforgettable vistas and swimming in natural pools.
- **Accommodation Options:**
  - Same hotel options as Day 17
- **[To Customize]:** Excursion focus, dinner style.

**TIP:** Distances between key sites can be 1–2.5h each way by car; tours usually include transport.

📍 **Day 21: Chapada Diamantina to Itacaré – Atlantic Forest to Beach**



- **Morning:** Private transfer to Itacaré (5.5h, with rest/lunch stop).
- **Afternoon:** Check-in at an eco-lodge near the beach.

- **Evening:** Dinner with ocean view.
- **Highlight:** Arrival on the wild Bahian coast.
- **Accommodation Options:**
  - **Aldeia do Mar Hotel** (eco-lodge) – On the beachfront near central Itacaré. Rustic-chic bungalows in garden setting, pool near the sea, relaxed vibe. From €70–110 per room/night (~€35–55 pp). Local materials, supports surf/fishing communities.
  - **Vila Barracuda Boutique Hotel & Bungalows** (eco-boutique) – Overlooking river and sea, quiet but near town. Design-focused, nature-comfort integration, excellent restaurant. From €110–160 per room/night (~€45–75 pp). Local fishermen/producers, boutique scale.
- **[To Customize]:** Lodge style, transfer stops.

**TIP:** Mosquito repellent is important in the forest; some eco-lodges use natural repellents and nets.

## **Day 22: Itacaré – Surf & Artisans**



- **Morning: Surf Lesson or Beach Yoga:** Lesson with local surf school on beginner-friendly beach (Engenhoca, Tiririca), or morning yoga session facing the ocean.  
*Duration:* 1.5–2h. *Price:* Surf €20–35 pp (board included); yoga €10–20 pp.
- **Afternoon: Artisan Market & Capoeira Demonstration:** Visit craft market for handmade jewelry, wood, textiles; attend or participate in a capoeira roda with local group.

*Duration:* 2–3h. *Price:* Market free (only purchases); capoeira demo/class €10–25 pp.

- **Evening:** Live music at a beach bar.
- **Highlight:** Fusion of beach culture and local tradition.
- **Accommodation Options:**
  - Same hotel options as Day 21
- **[To Customize]:** Activity choices, music style.

**TIP:** Surf beaches can be remote—use authorized transport or lodge-arranged taxis.

## **Day 23: Itacaré – Waterfalls & Forest Trails**



- **Morning: Tijupe Waterfall Hike:** Easy walk through Atlantic Forest to waterfall with natural pool; optional lunch at rustic restaurant.  
*Duration:* 2–3h. *Price:* €10–20 pp (entrance); transport from town extra or included in tour (€20–30 pp total).
- **Afternoon:** Free time on semi-private beaches.
- **Evening:** Optional: **Cooking Class (Bahian Cuisine):** Prepare moqueca (fish stew) or vegetarian Bahian dishes with local cook, then shared meal.  
*Duration:* 3–4h. *Price:* €30–50 pp.
- **Highlight:** Nature and relaxation in balance.

- **Accommodation Options:**

- Same hotel options as Day 21

- **[To Customize]:** Workshop interest, trail level.

**TIP:** Many eco-lodges provide filtered water—bring a reusable bottle.

📍 **Day 24: Itacaré – Free Day / Rest**



- **All Day:** Rest day. Optional: Massage, spa, or creative workshop.

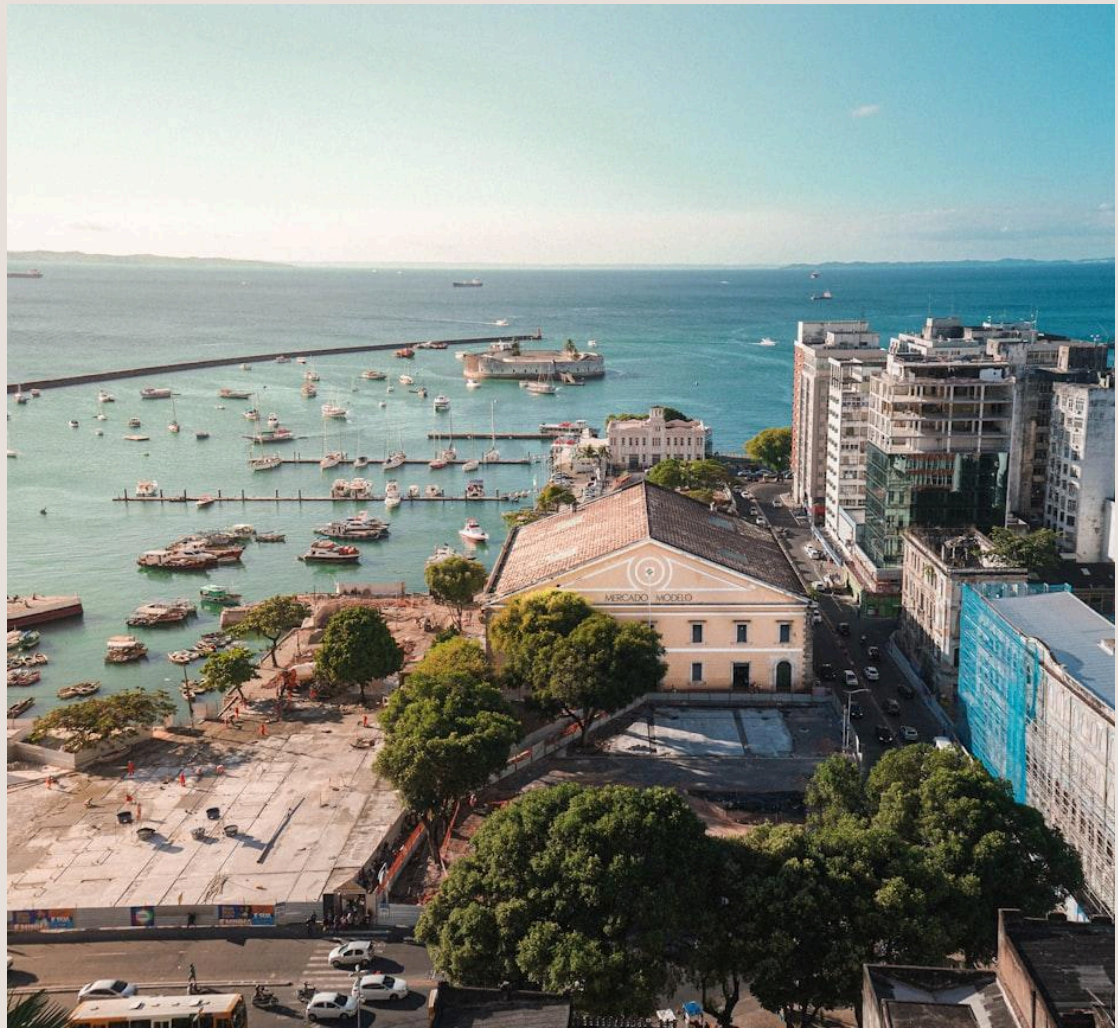
- **Highlight:** Final day to soak in the Atlantic coast's beauty.

- **Accommodation Options:**

- Same hotel options as Day 21
- **[To Customize]:** Activities or pure leisure.

**TIP:** Focus on small restaurants and lodges highlighting regional ingredients (Atlantic Forest fruits, Bahian cuisine, local fish).

## 📍 **Day 25: Itacaré to Salvador – Departure**



- **Morning:** Private transfer to Ilhéus airport (1.5h), flight to Salvador

(1h, buffer included).

- **Afternoon:** International flight home (flight time TBD).
- **Highlight:** Farewell to Brazil, with final ocean views.
- **[To Customize]:** Flight details, airport support.

**TIP:** Carry a mix of card and cash; rural and island regions can have patchy card connectivity.

## ✦ Customizable Options

- Upgrade to private guides in each region for deeper immersion.
- Switch some overland transfers to short domestic flights for comfort.
- Add creative workshops (ceramics, percussion, dance) in Paraty, Salvador, or Itacaré.
- Include more luxury eco-lodges or private villas in select stops.
- Extend time in a favorite region (e.g., extra days in Chapada or Itacaré).
- Arrange for local hosts or artist meet-and-greets.

**TIP:** Your plan (3–5 nights per region) is already sustainable, reducing transport emissions and letting you connect more deeply.

## ✦ Alternative Options

- **Faster Pace:** Reduce time in each region to add the Pantanal (wildlife safaris) or the Amazon (river lodge experience).

- **Budget Focus:** Opt for simpler pousadas and shared transfers; reduce private tours.
- **Regional Variation:** Focus more on the South (Florianópolis, Curitiba) for European-Brazilian culture and different art scenes.

**TIP:** Choose community-based or small local operators, especially for quilombo visits, fishermen lunches, music workshops and Chapada hikes.

## ✦ Practical Info & Budget

- **Seasonality:** July–August is winter in Brazil; mild temperatures in the Southeast, warmer in Bahia, occasional rain in the Atlantic Forest.
