
Welcome to Presentation Secondary School, Clonmel — a place where tradition meets innovation, and every student is encouraged to achieve her very best.

With construction soon to commence on a stateof-the-art **Specialties Building** and a major extension to our existing facilities, Presentation is reaffirming its commitment to **innovation**, **inclusion**, **and excellence** for the next generation of students.

The new standalone Specialties Building will feature a cutting-edge Art Room, a modern Technical Drawing Room, and additional STEM laboratories — world-class spaces designed to inspire creativity, critical thinking, and innovation.

In addition, a planned extension to the current building will provide **four top-class ASD classrooms** with dedicated associated spaces. These facilities will further enhance our ability to offer **a fully inclusive and supportive learning environment** where every student can thrive.



With work underway on our new Outdoor Biodiversity Classroom, Presentation continues to invest in facilities that inspire learning, curiosity, and innovation. This dedicated outdoor space will provide students with opportunities to explore the natural world first-hand, supporting study in science, geography, and environmental awareness.

Junior Cycle Curriculum

The Junior Cycle


The Junior Cycle is the first three years of post-primary education in Ireland. At Presentation Secondary School, it provides a strong foundation for learning, encouraging students to develop essential skills, explore new subjects, and build confidence for the years ahead. The Junior Cycle places a strong emphasis on creativity, critical thinking, and active learning, as well as personal and social development.

Assessment combines classroom-based work with final examinations, ensuring that each student's progress and achievements are recognised in a variety of ways. This approach helps students to become self-motivated, independent learners, ready to embrace the challenges of the Senior Cycle and beyond.

Junior Certificate School Programme (JCSP)

The JCSP is an intervention programme which supports students in achieving success in the Junior Cycle through a personalised, practical approach to learning. It focuses on building literacy, numeracy, and key life skills, while encouraging confidence and active participation. Students' achievements are celebrated through regular feedback, profiling, and special recognition events.



Senior Cycle Curriculum

Senior Cycle Curriculum

The Senior Cycle covers the final two or three years of post-primary education and prepares students for life after school — whether in further education, training, or employment. The Senior Cycle encourages independent thinking, responsibility, and academic excellence. Students deepen their knowledge in chosen subjects, develop transferable skills, and engage in projects, practical work, and research. Our dedicated teachers support each learner to reach her full potential, ensuring she is ready to take the next step with confidence. At Presentation Secondary School, Transition Year (Year 1 of Senior Cycle) is optional.

Transition Year Programme (Year 1 – Optional)

Transition Year at Presentation Secondary School combines academic learning with real-world experience. A central feature is our extensive work experience programme, giving students practical insights into careers and the workplace. Alongside projects, community involvement, and creative learning, TY fosters independence, confidence, and skills for future education and employment.

Leaving Certificate (Years 2-3)

The Leaving Certificate Established offers a broad, balanced curriculum across academic and practical subjects. Students select subjects that match their strengths and ambitions, preparing for further education, training, or employment. Our supportive environment and dedicated teaching help each student achieve her personal and academic goals.

Leaving Certificate Vocational Programme (Years 2-3 Optional)

At Presentation Secondary School, the LCVP is the same as the Established Leaving Certificate, but with two additional link modules — Preparation for the World of Work and Enterprise Education. These enhance academic learning with practical skills, work experience, and career preparation, connecting education directly to employment and enterprise.

Technology in Every Classroom – enhancing creativity, problem-solving, and engagement

We are proud to be shaping a progressive and innovative digital learning culture at Presentation Secondary School. Our education platform, Microsoft Teams, enables seamless communication, collaboration, and resource sharing between students and teachers, while VS Ware keeps parents and guardians informed in real time.

We are committed to equipping every student with the skills needed for a digital future. Our phased 1:1 Laptop Device initiative with Olive for Education begins in 2026, with full roll-out by 2028. We have an active Remote Learning Policy for unforeseen circumstances, an active Digital Strategy Team of teachers, and set annual Digital Learning targets to ensure technology is embedded meaningfully in teaching and learning.

Digital tools enhance lessons across all subjects, encouraging creativity, problem-solving, and innovation. Our students also benefit from unique opportunities such as the STEM Passport for Inclusion and participation in the DreamSpace Ambassador programme, further preparing them for future study and careers in science, technology, and beyond.

1st Year Induction Programme

Starting strong and growing with confidence and support

Our comprehensive 1st Year Induction Programme ensures a smooth and supportive transition to secondary school. It begins with CAT testing in February to help us understand each student's learning needs, followed by a Meet and Greet BBQ in August for students to connect before term starts. Throughout the year, 6th Year Leaders provide sustained peer support, while regular check-ins with the Year Head and daily morning assemblies help build relationships, confidence, and a strong sense of belonging at the Pres.



Pastoral Care System
