Brothers and sisters,

Working the land was part of my childhood. I was born and raised in a small town where farming was the way many families earned their daily bread.

At our home, we had a small garden, and it was there that I planted my very first tomato seeds. Every day I watered them with excitement, cared for the plant, and watched it grow little by little. Finally, the day came when I harvested the fruit of those seeds. I was so happy that I did not even want to eat that tomato—I wanted to keep it as a reminder of my very first harvest.

That experience helps me understand a profound truth about our faith. I firmly believe that God never grows tired of planting seeds of love, forgiveness, and mercy in our hearts. He does this with the hope that these seeds will bear fruit, so that we may share those same gifts with everyone around us. This is precisely what the Gospel for this Sunday reminds us.

Jesus presents us with the image of a sower who scatters seed everywhere, even in places where it seems certain to be wasted. From a human perspective, this may seem like a waste, but from God's perspective, it is a beautiful expression of His limitless love. God never stops believing in us. He does not sow only where the soil appears fertile; instead, He offers His Word to everyone, again and again.

However, the Gospel also invites us to look at the other side of the story: the soil where the seed falls. The same seed can produce an abundant harvest or fail to grow, depending on the condition of the heart that receives it. Too often, worries, selfishness, resentment, or indifference choke the seeds of love and forgiveness that God continually plants within our lives.

The perseverance of the sower is truly remarkable, but the harvest also depends on the condition of the soil. God desires to plant hope, peace, kindness, and mercy in our hearts. Yet if we do not cultivate hearts that are open, receptive, and willing to embrace His will, it will be difficult for those seeds to bear the fruit He longs to see.

Today the Lord invites each of us to ask ourselves: What kind of soil am I? God never stops sowing His grace in our lives. The decision to cultivate the soil so that His seed may take root and bear fruit belongs to each one of us.

3 minutes with Jesus: **Daily Reflection points for the Week**

Sunday

Jesus never stops sowing the seeds of His love and grace into our hearts. What seed do I sense Jesus planting in my heart today, and am I willing to receive it?

Monday

The seed can only grow if the soil is open. What is making my heart "hard" right now, preventing God's Word from sinking in more deeply?

Tuesday

The seed on rocky ground had no deep roots. What am I doing each day to deepen my roots in Christ so that my faith can withstand life's difficulties?

Wednesday

The thorns choked the seed. What worries, distractions, or attachments have been taking up too much space in my heart, leaving less room for Jesus?

Thursday

The good soil received the seed and produced abundant fruit. If Jesus were to plant a new seed in my heart today, what fruit do I think He most desires to grow in my life?

Friday

The sower scattered seed generously without giving up. Where have I been tempted to think God has given up on me, and how does this Gospel remind me that He never stops working in my life?

Saturday

"Whoever has ears ought to hear." As I look back over this week, how have I heard Jesus speaking to me, and what is one concrete way I can respond to His invitation today?

The Gardener and the Soil

I began writing this piece by googling “how do you make soil fertile?” which should tell you everything you need to know about my own abilities as a gardener.

I remember seeing a packet of seeds in the store one summer as a child and convincing my mother to buy them. They were delphiniums, which bloom into a beautiful cone shape if you know what you’re doing. Alas, I didn’t. I chose for my garden a particularly dry spot of earth right next to my backyard playset, scattered the seeds, congratulated myself, and went on my merry way. I returned occasionally to water the area, but only when I remembered to.

Nothing grew, not even a little sprout. I was more than heartbroken — my faith was shaken. I had planted these seeds! I had watered them! (A little.) There was sunlight! All my childhood books and rhymes said this was all you needed. Was it all a lie?

Of course it wasn’t a lie. Seeds need soil, sunlight, water, and oxygen — good soil, adequate sunlight for whatever the plant is, and consistent water.

So what seeds need more than anything is a gardener. (At least, delphiniums do.)

When I hear the parable of the rich soil and the rocky ground in the Gospel of Matthew, I often miss the point. I think Jesus is trying to give me a message about how I should be. “Be better.” That’s what I think he’s telling me.

I forget that I am only the soil. I cannot enrich myself; all my efforts to do so will come to nothing. What he is telling me is to ask the gardener: “Make me what I need to be.”

St. Kateri Tekakwitha

On July 14th, we celebrate the feast of the “Lily of the Mohawks.” St. Kateri Tekakwitha is the first Native American woman to be canonized. Orphaned by a smallpox outbreak, Kateri survived with severe scarring

and impaired eyesight. Despite tragedy, she was a devout girl at a young age, often building crosses from sticks in the woods. When she was 18, she began secret instruction in the Catholic faith with French missionaries. Her commitment to Christianity and vow of virginity was misunderstood and ridiculed by her fellow villagers. She escaped to a nearby mission, where she attended daily Mass, taught the children, and cared for the sick and the elderly. Sometimes the greatest misunderstandings can come from those closest to us. Like St. Kateri, God invites us to be faithful to our commitments of faith and to always respond in love.

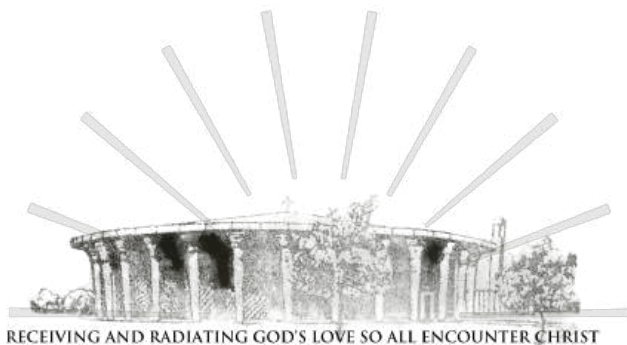
