From the Desk of Fr. Keith Romke

Dearest Brothers and Sisters,

As we begin another school year, there is something both exciting and humbling about standing at the beginning of a journey. There are new teachers, new classes, new activities, new friendships, and

new challenges. We may have a plan for how we hope the year will unfold, but none of us knows exactly what the months ahead will bring.

That uncertainty can sometimes make us hesitant to take the first step. We may wonder: *Will I be able to handle everything? Will all this hard work be worth it? Where will I be by the end of the year?*

Our faith reminds us that we do not take those steps alone. Jesus is with us not only when things are going well, but especially when we cannot yet see where the road will lead. He asks us to trust Him one step at a time.

May the Lord bless our students, families, teachers, and everyone beginning a new school year. May we have the courage to begin, the perseverance to continue, and the faith to trust that Jesus is with us every step of the way.

Friday

Jesus knows our weaknesses and still chooses to work through us. *Where can I allow Jesus to work through me today?*

Saturday

A life built on Christ can stand firm even when life feels uncertain. *What can I do today to build my life more firmly on Jesus?*

Javelin Prayers

Have you ever tried to pray when right after you start, you find your mind wandering off thinking about something else? Who of us can actually pray even one Our Father without something distracting us? If you are able, then blessed are you!

The Church Fathers, after identifying the many distractions that come from living in the world, chose to renounce all worldly things, their wealth, their jobs, even their families ... and head off into solitude ... to caves, to the desert, to any place that did not attach them to worldly things. For they knew that the infernal enemy of souls, would use worldly allurements to take their minds off of God; and what could be more reasonable, more edifying, more efficacious than to contemplate God, who is all good and deserving of all our love? For this is what we were made for, this is what we will be doing with all the Holy Angels and Saints for all eternity in Heaven!

Having address the main thing that stood in their way from being more fully in union with the God of the universe, they were ready to pray and to pray always just like St. Paul told us to!

1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

“Rejoice always, **pray constantly**, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.”

But they soon found this not to be the case. Yes, they had given up every worldly thing. Yes, they had removed all external distractions. What went wrong? Why was prayer still so difficult? Well, nothing went wrong, or rather, what went wrong was the Fall. Because of the Fall, our minds are easily distracted, and none of us can escape this on our own. It is a consequence of being human, because our human nature has been corrupted. Even if one were to remove all possible external distractions, internal distractions would still have the possibility of taking their gaze off of the Lord. These Church Fathers might be thinking during prayer about when they would have their next meal, or about their health, or about what their other brothers in solitude might be thinking about them or countless other things. What could be done in this seeming impossible trap?

They were given the grace to discover Javelin Prayers. Short little prayers that they could say throughout the day. Prayers like: “Jesus, I trust in You”, “Lord, come to my assistance – Lord, make haste to help me”, “Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner”. “Blessed be God forever”, “Lord, I love you – help me to love you more”, “Glory to God in the Highest”, or my recent favorite, “Live in My Victory”. Javelin Prayers such as these help us to recollect all that God has done for us, is doing, and has yet to do. They change the trajectory of the moment from distraction or worry or despair to God and heavenly things, thus allowing

us to sanctify the moment by practicing the presence of God in the moment. We can do this throughout the day even putting them to song within our hearts or out loud shouting out our joy from the mountaintops.

So, the next time you find yourself distracted, worried, anxious or you come to the realization that you haven’t thought about the One who loves you more than you can imagine for too long, try offering up a Javelin Prayer.

This week we celebrate two saints, a mother and son: St. Monica and St. Augustine. As a young Christian woman, St. Monica was married to a pagan. Early in their marriage, he was bitter and critical. After nearly 20 years, Monica's holy example led to his conversion to Christianity. In the meantime, Augustine was a teenager beginning to live a wild life of self-indulgent excess. This lifestyle would continue into his adulthood. Like with her husband, Monica prayed and fasted for the conversion of her son.

Augustine met another future saint, the bishop Ambrose of Milan, who greatly influenced his perspective on life. Augustine was baptized a Christian! Augustine later became a bishop and one of the most influential thinkers in Christian history. How's that for the power of patience and intercessory prayer?
