From the Desk of Fr. Keith Romke

Dearest Brothers and Sisters,

A truly beautiful thing within our Catholic faith is that Christ is not meant to be part of only one corner of our lives. We're of course called bring Jesus with us out into the world when we walk out the doors of the church. We are called to bring him to our homes, our schools, our workplaces, our friendships, and even into the things we do simply for recreation.

This is one of the reasons the Church has the tradition of blessing objects.

We are accustomed to having rosaries, crucifixes, medals, statues, and other sacred objects that we'd find in the Church blessed. But the Church also recognizes that God's grace touches the ordinary circumstances of our lives. We can ask God to bless the things we use, the work we do, and the activities through which we experience community, friendship, joy, and recreation.

Let me give you an example: What about something as ordinary as a sports jersey?

The jersey itself isn't sacred. But blessing it would serve as a reminder that Christ is present in the life of the person who wears it. As we begin another football season and baseball heads toward the playoffs, it seems like a fitting time to remember this. And, remarkably, Chicago baseball fans have been given something we rarely get to experience: both the Cubs and the White Sox playing well at the same time! That is certainly a "blessing!"

We might not often have this at the forefront of our minds, but whether we're playing or cheering, sports can give us opportunities to live our faith. They teach us perseverance, discipline, teamwork, humility, courage, and sportsmanship. They teach us how to handle victory and disappointment, how to encourage others, and how to treat our opponents with dignity. Our faith belongs there, too.

For this reason, to help us call to mind and connect our lives of Faith in all areas of our life, next weekend, at all of our Masses on September 12 and 13, we will offer a Blessing of Jerseys! I especially invite our student athletes to bring their own jerseys to Mass so that we can pray for them and their seasons. But this blessing isn't limited just to them! Anyone is welcome to bring a jersey: whether it is a Cubs or White Sox jersey, a Bears jersey, a favorite professional team, or a jersey from a sport you play or love (and to highlight the universality of the Church and the fact that God loves everyone, I'll go ahead and say that even jerseys that happen to be green and gold can and will be blessed if you bring them!)

There is of course a time and a place for everything, and we want to bring Jesus into it all! So, I'm asking you not to wear the jersey at Mass, but to simply bring it with you. At the appropriate time, we'll invite those who have brought jerseys to hold them up at the end of Mass. We're not having a "Sports Mass" but rather reminding ourselves that when we leave Mass Christ comes with us into all that we do! For anyone who understandably may question the purpose of this I want to make it clear that we don't do this expecting God to make our team win, and certainly not because a blessed jersey becomes a lucky jersey! We do it because we want to remember that Christ is with us in every part of our lives. When we step onto the football field, baseball diamond, soccer pitch, basketball court, volleyball court, golf course, or any other playing field, we don't leave our faith on the sidelines.

When we compete, Christ is with us. When we win, Christ is with us. When we lose, Christ is with us. When we celebrate with our teammates and friends, Christ is with us. And when we face disappointment, frustration, or failure, Christ is with us then, too.

Perhaps the next time you put on your jersey, let it remind you of something bigger than the team on the front: I belong to Christ, and wherever I go, He goes with me. Our Catholic faith isn't something we put on only when we come to Mass. We carry Christ with us into every part of our lives: Even onto the playing field.

Listening to the Hispanic community chant the “Chaplet of Divine Mercy” on Thursday. I felt Jesus’ joy at His hearing it. He was there.

When I greeted my hospital bound close friend, we both had delight in our eyes. Jesus was there with us.

Getting a call from someone about the seriousness of our good friend’s illness. God was with us on that call.

Just listening to each of you share your “moments” makes me feel that God is present right here with us.

St. Peter Claver

“The proof of love is in the works. Where love exists, it works great things.”



Born in Catalonia, Spain, in 1580, St. Peter Claver studied first at the University of Barcelona and then joined the Jesuits. He became friends with fellow brother St. Alphonsus Rodriguez, who encouraged him to be a missionary in the New World. Accordingly, St. Peter went to Cartagena, a city in present-day Colombia, where he was ordained in 1615.

Cartagena was a center for the slave trade, and the young missionary knew where he could best serve God. As ships would arrive with their human cargo, Saint Peter and a group of interpreters would rush into the hold with food and medicines. When the slaves were moved to pens to await sale, the saint continued to work among them, communicating God’s love with acts of generosity and teaching the Catholic faith.

He also led missions in the interior, refusing the hospitality of plantation owners and preferring to stay in the slave quarters. He organized charitable societies and is said to have baptized and catechized more than 300,000 enslaved persons.

St. Peter Claver died on September 8, 1654. He was canonized with his friend St. Alphonsus Rodriguez in 1888 by Pope Leo XIII. He is the worldwide patron saint of African Americans and of enslaved peoples.
