Message from the Principal

As October draws to a close, it certainly feels like a warm summer is on its way. Our junior students are enjoying weekly swimming lessons, and our older students are making the most of the sunshine with visits to the waterhole.

On the academic front, our senior students remain focused on their exams. We are also pleased to report that our Year 6 and 9 students have now finished their checkpoint exams, and their papers are in transit to the UK. I am extremely proud of how all our students have prepared for and participated in these exams. Congratulations to everyone for working so hard to achieve their best. We are incredibly proud of you all.

A special congratulations goes to our international students who completed their PADI Dive courses this month. They have gained a valuable life skill and wonderful memories to take back home with them. We have been spoilt this week as they have been practicing dishes from their homelands, and I was one of the lucky ones who got to test them!

Thank you to everyone who participated in our recent survey on cell phone usage. This has provided valuable data for the team creating the 'Cell Phone-Free and Social Media-Free Until 16' pact, which will be available shortly for any families who wish to join. The survey is still open, but to date the initial findings are significant:

- Well over 50% of respondents would consider not providing their child with a cell phone until they are over 16.
- Half of the current students with a cell phone do not have access to social media.
- 100% of respondents (from both parent and child perspectives) said their child experienced addictive use or compulsive checking of their phone.
- 80% of the students, when asked, agreed they had experienced disrupted sleep and exposure to inappropriate content.

More information will follow once the team has collated all the data.

Finally, it is hard to believe there are only five weeks left until the end of term, and we still have so much to look forward to. Remember to start your Christmas shopping at our **Market** Day on Saturday, 16th November. The students are busy planning, preparing, and producing their products, and I have already got my eye on some great gift ideas.



Tri Oceans




