

## Luke 1:26-38

<sup>26</sup> In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a city of Galilee named Nazareth, <sup>27</sup> to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. And the virgin's name was Mary. <sup>28</sup> And he came to her and said, "Greetings, O favored one, the Lord is with you!" <sup>29</sup> But she was greatly troubled at the saying, and tried to discern what sort of greeting this might be. <sup>30</sup> And the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. 31 And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus.
<sup>32</sup> He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. And the Lord God will give to him the throne of his father David, <sup>33</sup> and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end."

34 And Mary said to the angel, "How will this be, since I am a virgin?"

<sup>35</sup> And the angel answered her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be called holy—the Son of God. <sup>36</sup> And behold, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son, and this is the sixth month with her who was called barren. <sup>37</sup> For nothing will be impossible with God." <sup>38</sup> And Mary said, "Behold, I am the servant of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word." And the angel departed from her.

Read | Put away distractions, pause in silence, and pray "Come Holy Spirit." Then read the passage slowly—maybe more than once—and notice what stands out.

**Examine** | What does this show about God, Jesus, or me? What was it saying to the original audience?

**Apply** | Consider what the Holy Spirit might be inviting you to do and how this passage shapes your life as an apprentice of Jesus.

**Pray** | End by talking with God-share struggles, give thanks, ask for guidance, and listen.

God of ordinary wonders, awaken Your joy in us as we trust Your quiet, faithful work.




his time of year we have endless opportunities and options for things to say yes to. There is a lot of movement, and a good amount is very good and joyful. However, the holiday season can offer us the unique opportunity to evaluate and calibrate what we are giving our "yes" to. It's an opportunity to be near the Father's voice and to be quick and eager to enter into where and what He is calling us to — and that may just surprise us!

In the story of Jesus, we see that Mary and Joseph gave their "yes" to the Lord and played a pivotal and humble role in the story of the gospel that altered humanity forever. Now, let's be real, they had to be terrified. This wasn't in their plans. This required GREAT sacrifice that we can hardly even imagine in our culture today.

The Lord is always, *literally always*, calling us into something. He is calling you into something. What an honor, if we really sit

with that: the God of the universe is calling us to partner with Him in this whole thing. Whether it is to show up every day consistently, completely drenched and oozing in the Holy Spirit at our 9-5, to shepherd and steward your children to be exceptional humans, to show up in your neighborhood or community in a particular way, or to make a move to a different city away from your friends and community, the challenge is to be close enough to the Father's voice to hear His gentle whisper and to be bold and obedient to say, "Yes, Lord," and go absolutely crush it. What I have found is that my life becomes extremely interesting when I give God my "yes." I wonder what our community could look like this season if all of us entered boldly and courageously into the "yes" God is calling us into.
