

Students Raise Over \$16,000 for the Northeast Iowa Food Bank Through Annual Student Food Drive

WATERLOO, Iowa (November 14, 2025) – Students across seven local high schools participated in the Northeast Iowa Food Bank's 2025 Student Food Drive. Beginning October 6, Cedar Falls, Hudson, Waterloo West, Waterloo East, Janesville, North Tama, and Valley Lutheran rallied to raise funds, volunteer, and collect food for community members facing food insecurity.

Together they contributed:

- 398 volunteer hours
- 6,545 pounds of food
- \$16,260.59 raised

Highlights of the 2025 Student Food Drive

- Waterloo East High had the most volunteer hours with 166 hours.
- **Cedar Falls High School** raised the most money with \$8,257.81.
- Valley Lutheran School hosted the most events with 15 events.
- Hudson High School collected the most pounds of food with 3,372 pounds and the most social media posts with 17 posts, making them the overall winner.

This year, schools in the Student Food Drive competed in six categories: most pounds of food collected, most money raised, most volunteer hours, most events hosted, most social media posts, and overall winner. Each category winner received a cash prize for their school, and the overall winner also earned a banner to display at their school.

NEIFB Executive Director, Barbara Prather, expressed her gratitude at the event's conclusion, recognizing the work the students had done. "The habits you built here, serving, inviting others to join you, and using your voice, will carry far beyond today. Whether you keep volunteering, advocate, host a future drive, or pursue a career serving others, you now know you can make a measurable difference."
