


Northeast Iowa Food Bank Distributes Over 3,500 Holiday Meals During Annual Holiday Distribution Event

WATERLOO, Iowa (December 1, 2025) - More than 45,000 northeast lowans are unsure where their next meal will come from, creating added stress and uncertainty during the holiday season. To help meet the growing need, the Northeast Iowa Food Bank held its annual Holiday Distribution event during Thanksgiving week, providing thousands of families in Black Hawk County with nutritious holiday meals.
