Northeast Iowa Food Bank promotes Becca Huber to Director of Distribution

Huber has served as the organization's Food Sourcing Manager since March 2020, where she has made a lasting impact by strengthening partnerships with local food retailers, expanding sourcing opportunities, and elevating food safety strategies across the organization.

“We are thrilled to have Becca continue her journey with the Food Bank in this new leadership role,” said Executive Director, Barbara Prather. “In her previous position, she strengthened and elevated our food sourcing and food safety



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strategies, helping ensure we serve our community with excellence and integrity. This promotion marks the next step in her growth as a leader, and we're excited to see her passion, expertise, and deep knowledge of our mission help guide the Food Bank into the future."

Huber steps into the role following the retirement of Mike Weiss, who has served as Director of Distribution since June 2023. Weiss played a key leadership role in several major operational initiatives, including warehouse re-racking efforts and helping with the Food Bank's current Capacity Campaign, helping position the organization for long-term growth and increased impact.

"Mike brought thoughtful leadership and operational excellence to our team during a pivotal time of growth," Prather said. "His strategic mindset and dedication to strengthening our infrastructure have helped ensure we can serve more northeast Iowans more efficiently, and with greater impact.
