

CORPORATE CARBON FOOTPRINT POLICY

Purpose

This policy outlines ORE Supplies Ltd.'s commitment to minimizing its environmental impact by measuring, monitoring, and reducing its carbon footprint. As a micro entity operating from a shared office space, our primary emissions are indirect (Scope 2 and Scope 3), and our focus is on energy efficiency, sustainable procurement, and digital-first practices.

Scope

This policy applies to all ORE Supplies Ltd.'s operations, employees, and contractors. It covers:

- Energy use in our shared office environment.
- · Business travel and commuting.
- · IT equipment and digital services.
- · Procurement and waste management.

Guiding Principles

We commit to:

- · Minimizing energy use: Encouraging efficient use of computers and office equipment.
- Sustainable digital operations: Reducing emissions from cloud services and data storage.
- Low-carbon commuting: Supporting remote work and sustainable travel options.
- Responsible procurement: Choosing low-impact vendors and recycled materials where possible,
- · Waste reduction: Minimizing e-waste and ensuring proper recycling or reuse.

Carbon Emissions Sources (Material to Us)

Given our business model, our key carbon emission sources are:

- Scope 2 (Indirect): Electricity usage from shared office operations.
- Scope 3 (Other Indirect):
 - · Cloud computing and data storage.
 - · Employee commuting and occasional travel.
 - Supply chain suppliers of aggregates, concrete, asphalt and other building materials; plus supplier of waste remover and disposal services.

We aim to estimate and report on these emissions annually using best-effort approaches suitable for a company of our size.

Reduction Measures

We aim to reduce our carbon footprint through the following measures:

- Energy-efficient operations:
 - Use energy-saving settings on all devices.
 - · Shut down equipment when not in use.
 - Encourage shared use of peripherals (printers, monitors).

· Digital sustainability:

- Choose cloud providers with net-zero or renewable commitments.
- Minimize unnecessary data storage and bandwidth usage.

Travel and commuting:

- Promote remote meetings and video conferencing.
- · Encourage use of public transport, cycling, or walking.

Procurement:

- · Prioritize used or refurbished equipment.
- · Select vendors with sustainability credentials.

• Procurement supply chain:

- · Prioritize recycled materials where possible.
- Select supplier closest in geographical location to site.
- Obtain Carbon Footprint information relating to product supplied.
- Test waste material to provide appropriate disposal (recycling where possible).

Waste:

- · Recycle office materials and electronics responsibly.
- · Reduce printing and opt for digital-first communication.

Monitoring & Reporting

- We will conduct an annual self-assessment of our carbon footprint using simplified tools (e.g. SME carbon calculators).
- Progress will be reviewed yearly and shared with employees and stakeholders as part of our transparency commitment.

Responsibility

- · Leadership: Overall responsibility for policy implementation lies with Oliver Rudd, Director.
- All employees: Expected to support this policy and follow sustainable practices in daily work.

Review

This policy will be reviewed annually or sooner if there are significant changes to the business model or operational footprint.
