The Big Beautiful Bill and Your Taxes:

What's Inside the Big, Beautiful Bill—and How It Affects Your Taxes

The One Big Beautiful Bill Act, signed into law on July 4, 2025, brings major changes to how Americans file and pay taxes. One of the biggest updates is the increase in the standard deduction—now \$15,750 for single filers, \$23,625 for heads of household, and \$31,500 for married couples filing jointly. That means more of your income is shielded from taxes right off the bat. The bill also removes personal exemptions but adds a new "senior bonus" deduction of \$6,000 for older taxpayers. These changes are designed to make filing simpler and help more families keep money in their pockets.

Beyond deductions, the bill offers targeted tax breaks for working families and small businesses. The child tax credit is now permanently higher, and small business owners can continue to claim a 20% deduction on pass-through income. If you earn tips or work overtime, good news—those earnings are now tax-free under certain conditions. Seniors get extra tax relief, and starting in 2026, anyone who donates to charity can claim a deduction even if they don't itemize—\$1,000 for individuals and \$2,000 for couples. These updates aim to reward hard work, support families, and encourage generosity.







The John Muir Trail (JMT) is a roughly 230+ mile hiking trail in the high Sierra Nevada mountains of California, running from Yosemite Valley to Mount Whitney. Known for its spectacular scenery, it passes through Yosemite, Kings Canyon, and Sequoia National Parks, as well as the John Muir and Ansel Adams Wilderness areas. The trail is a challenging backpacking trip featuring high-altitude peaks, thousands of lakes, and a demanding physical journey requiring careful logistical planning and permits.

Every year an estimated 1,500 hikers begin the journey and only around 400 finish. Congratulations to Dan, Billy, and Mike who spent 17 days backpacking and camping in the mountains and completed the JMT!!!


