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## 1. Introduction, background and purpose

From 1 October 2024 employers are required to comply with The Ionising Radiation (Medical Exposure) (Amendment) Regulations 2024. There is a new requirement to work together where two or more employers have a shared responsibility for the referral, justification, exposure, or clinical evaluation of an individual.

The aim of this Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) is to provide a structured and compliant process that allows Specialist Registrar and Senior Nurse Specialists to refer patients for PET-CT under formal entitlement from their employing organisation, supported by a GMC-registered Consultant Practitioner. This SOP is designed to reduce treatment delays, promote timely access to imaging, and support high-quality patient care. Entitlement is given in accordance with IR(ME)R 2017 and must be explicitly confirmed by the Employer.

### 2. Who should use this SOP?

- Senior Nurse Specialists registered with the NMC
- Specialist Registrar registered with the GMC
- Consultant practitioners
- IR(M)ER Practitioners and Operators
- All staff managing the patient referral pathway and to whom it may concern.



#### Referrers must:

Be formally entitled by their employing organisation under Regulation 6 of IR(ME)R 2017

Work within a defined clinical team with oversight from a GMC-registered Consultant Practitioner

Submit written evidence of entitlement and scope of practice

Note: Entitlement must not be confused with delegation. The Consultant Practitioner may endorse the referrer's competence, but entitlement must be given by the Employer.

## 3. When this SOP Should be Used

This SOP should be referenced whenever a Specialist Registrar or Senior Nurse Specialist referrers a patient for PET-CT as entitled by their employer and endorsed by the referring GMC Registered Medical Consultant.

Senior Nurse Specialist's attention is brought to the NMC "The Code for nurses and midwives" (2018), in particular:

Recognise and work within the limits of your competence

To achieve this, you must:

- make a timely and appropriate referral to another practitioner when it is in the best interests of the individual needing any action, care or treatment
- ask for help from a suitably qualified and experienced healthcare professional to carry out any action or procedure that is beyond the limits of your competence
- complete the necessary training before carrying out a new role.

#### Furthermore:

The Specialist Registrar and Senior Nurse Specialist requesting the PET-CT scan is clinically responsible for ensuring the resulting imaging is acted upon and brought to the attention of the appropriate medical staff in a timely manner.

If the Senior Nurse Specialist is not sufficiently confident to request a particular examination, or it is not within their scope of practice, the Consultant Medical Referrer must be asked to assess the patient and request accordingly.

# 4. Procedure(s)

#### 4.1 Examinations

4.1.1 Examinations and requests will be limited to the following views and under the following clinical indications:

After recommendation from MDT or discussion with the consultant responsible for the patient to stage disease, or if recurrence is suspected or if dictated by trial protocol:

- · FDG for oncology
- FDG for infection/inflammation
- F18-PSMA Prostate only

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- 4.1.2 Each **Senior Nurse Specialist** trained and competent in the ordering of PET-CT examinations will provide Alliance Medical with a signed proforma confirming details of their entitlement to refer. The proforma at **Appendix One** can be used, this will include:
  - The Senior Nurse Specialist's full name
  - NMC number
  - Specimen signatures
  - Name and GMC Number of Endorsing Medical Consultant(s).

The list must be reviewed annually and re-submitted to AML.

- 4.1.3 Each **Specialist Registrar** entitled to order PET-CT examinations will provide Alliance Medical with a signed proforma confirming details of their entitlement to refer. The proforma **at Appendix Two** can be used, this will include:
  - The Specialist Registrar's full name
  - GMC number
  - Specimen signatures
  - Name and GMC Number of Endorsing Medical Consultant(s).

The list must be reviewed annually and resubmitted to AML.

4.1.4 All PET-CT referrals will be validated, and a scanning protocol assigned, by the relevant IR(ME)R Practitioner or entitled Operator.

#### 4.2 Queries

- 4.2.1 Queries regarding the Imaging requests will be made to the individual Specialist Registrar or Senior Nurse Specialist
  - Specialist concerned by the IR(ME)R Practitioner or entitled Operator
- 4.2.2 If the IR(ME)R Practitioner or entitled operator feels that a PET-CT request is unjustified or poorly localised, they have the right to discuss the referral with the chair of the relevant MDT, as in the case with medical staff.
- 4.2.3 All such incidents must be brought to the attention of the AML Medical Director if not resolved locally.

#### 4.3 Making the Referral

- 4.3.1 The Specialist Registrar or Senior Nurse Specialist will request Imaging examinations within defined categories when necessary. The request will be made using the AML e-referral portal, Trust order comms where HL7 integration is complete, or via an electronic or hardcopy request.
  - Submission of the entitlement proforma (Appendix 1, 2) and a signed copy of the Terms and Conditions of use (Appendix 4) is required.
  - Confirmation of authorisation to refer will be provided and where required access to the AML e-referral portal will be granted.
- 4.3.2 The Specialist Registrar and Senior Nurse Specialist will:
  - Ensure all relevant patient demographic data is provided
  - Provide concise relevant clinical information, i.e. surgery, malignancy findings on examination, what is the clinical question that you want answering.

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- State the date of LMP where applicable
- State whether or not any relevant imaging examination has been carried out before
- Provide full clinical details to allow justification of the imaging request in line with authorisation guidelines
- Complete the Clinical Indication coding

#### 4.4 Status of staff authorised to take responsibility for undertaking this procedure

#### Senior Nurse Specialists: See Appendix 1

- Registered with the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC)
- Who have undergone training in respect of both the requesting of x-rays and radiation protection IR(ME)R (link e-IR(ME)R training modules)

e-IRMER Module 02 – Management and radiation protection of the patient

e-IRMER Module 03 – Legal requirements

This training will encompass the following:

Potential hazards in irradiating patients and an understanding of the associated regulations.

Contraindications to referral for imaging and the risk of unnecessary exposure to ionising radiation.

Radiation protection of high-risk groups.

The role of the Referrer, Operator and Practitioner.

- Have evidence of competency, recorded qualification e.g. colorectal nursing qualification
- Can demonstrate continued knowledge and competency for requesting imaging, specifically PET-CT, within their Scope of Practice
- Senior Nurse Specialists will be expected to keep records of their own practice for inclusion in their professional portfolio.

#### Specialist Registrars: See Appendix 2

- Registered with the General Medical Council (GMC)
- Holding Specialist Registrar position for a Medical Consultant
- Who have undergone training in respect of both the requesting of x-rays and radiation protection IR(ME)R (link e-IR(ME)R training module)

e-IRMER Module 02 - Management and radiation protection of the patient

e-IRMER Module 03 – Legal requirements

This training will encompass the following:

Potential hazards in irradiating patients and an understanding of the associated regulations.

Contraindications to referral for imaging and the risk of unnecessary exposure to ionising radiation.

Radiation protection of high-risk groups.

The role of the Referrer, Operator and Practitioner.

- Can demonstrate knowledge and competency for requesting imaging, specifically PET-CT within their Scope of Practice
- Entitled by their employer to request a PET-CT referral as defined in IR(ME)R with a Scope of Practice that includes PET-CT, - Authorisation Guidelines

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#### **Group Entitlement for Specialist Registrar: See Appendix 3**

Specialist Registrar may be authorised under a group entitlement arrangement, operating within the supervision of Medical Consultants.

- Registered with the General Medical Council (GMC)
- Holding a Specialty Registrar training position within [Oncology / Haematology / Radiology] at [Trust/Organisation]
- Who have undergone training in respect of both the requesting of x-rays and radiation protection IR(ME)R (link e-IR(ME)R training modules)
- Can demonstrate knowledge and competency for requesting imaging, specifically PET-CT, within their Scope of Practice
- Entitled by their employer to request a PET-CT referral as defined in IR(ME)R with a Scope of Practice that includes PET-CT, - Authorisation Guidelines
- Referrals must be submitted in the name of the supervising Consultant, with the Specialist Registrar's involvement traceable in the referral form
- Included within the Employer's Group Entitlement the following criteria must be defined:

The Consultants whose entitlement extends to Specialist Registrar

The Specialist Registrar group covered (e.g. "All Haematology Specialist Registrar rotating through [Trust]")

The specific clinical indications / scope permitted for PET-CT referral

Accountability for all referrals remains with the Supervising Consultant

The referring Trust is responsible for auditing referrals made under group entitlement in accordance with their IR(ME)R Employer's Procedures. AML will verify, through its own quality assurance programme, that appropriate audit activity is being undertaken and will request evidence of audit outcomes at agreed intervals. Any unresolved issues of compliance will be escalated to the AML Medical Director and the Trust's Radiation Protection Committee

### 5. Training

#### 5.1 Mandatory Training

Annual training in referral for Ionising Radiation, to include:

- referral criteria for PET-CT scans, including pregnancy and breast feeding
- Responsibility for providing sufficient medical data relevant to the exposure (authorisation guidelines)
- Understanding of (IR(ME)R 2017) including awareness of risk of radiation exposure

### 6. Monitoring Compliance with this Document
