Commitment to achieving Net Zero

Alliance Medical Limited and its subsidiaries are fully committed to supporting the NHS with its Green Agenda and environmental targets; our aim being to achieve Net Zero by 2035 for the emissions that we control directly and to achieve Net Zero by 2045 for those emissions that we can influence.

Baseline and Current Emissions Footprint

Alliance Medical's Carbon Reduction Plan covers both its scanning and radiopharmaceutical facilities.

Alliance Medical does not believe that it has any Scope 3 Category 9 downstream transportation and distribution emissions to report, as no product is transported or distributed after the point of sale.

Dual (market and location based) reporting of Scope 2 electricity has been adopted since FY23 to reflect that, for the static sites:

- ▶ The electricity supplied in direct supply contracts was (REGO backed) 100% renewable
- ▶ The majority of electricity supplied through NHS Trusts was denoted as green (further validation ongoing)

In addition to the items shared in the table, Alliance Medical has also evaluated and is tracking the following Scope 3 cat 3 "overheads" as part of its SECR;

- ▶ Well to Tank (WtT) Fuels
- ▶ WtT UK Electricity Generation
- ▶ Transmission and Distribution (T&D) Grid Losses UK Electricity
- ▶ WtT UK Electricity (T&D)

Wherever available, actual verified primary source physical data has been used. In accordance with the guidance, where such data was not available, estimates have been made by direct comparison, pro-rata extrapolation, benchmarking or modelling.

Current Carbon Reduction Projects

In FY25, Alliance Medical contracted to purchase 100% renewable energy for all its directly controlled sites for the next 3 years.

Further investment in our car fleet ensured a greater offering of EVs across all car grades. With a record 123 electric plug-in vehicles, the proportion of electrified vehicles on the fleet has increased to 42%, with a further increase expected in FY26.

Dinnington Radiopharmacy site installed EV chargers in FY25, adding to those already installed at the Warwick Head Office, Guildford PET and Oldham Community Diagnostic Centre sites.

We commenced swap out of all mobile scanner diesel generators to battery generators at the end of FY25. Following successful stress testing, diesel consumption savings of 90% are now being realised. Where diesel is required to recharge the battery for 2 hours each day, the more emission friendly white diesel is used.

After continued work to optimise the Building Management System settings at our Turner Diagnostic Centre in Colchester, full year savings of 194,000kWh were achieved in FY25. Similarly, Taunton Diagnostic Centre

completed the swap out of both car park and all internal lighting at its facility which will realise future annual consumption savings of 70,000kWh.

Alliance Medical renewed its ISO14001 Environmental Management System Accreditation for The Management of Diagnostic Imaging Service and Supply of Radiopharmaceuticals.

Emissions Reduction Targets

To continue Alliance Medical's progress to achieving Net Zero, it is reviewing appropriate measures that can be implemented to achieve the timelines set.

Alliance Medical projects that over the five years to 2026/27 its annual carbon emissions will reduce to 7,527.6 tCO₂e (market based), a reduction of approximately 30% (3,226.1 tCO₂e) compared with Baseline Year 2021/22.

Alliance Medical has made further progress towards this target with a reduction of -2,791.6 tCO₂e or -26.0% (market based) for FY25 cf. baseline FY22. Alliance Medical is a growing business and shares intensity ratios (tCO₂e/FTE) as well as absolute targets to ensure that the business can identify good practice if growth continues.

Declaration and Sign Off

This Carbon Reduction Plan has been completed in accordance with PPN 06/21 and associated guidance and reporting standard for Carbon Reduction Plans.

Emissions have been reported and recorded in accordance with the published reporting standard for Carbon Reduction Plans and the GHG Reporting Protocol corporate standard¹ and uses the appropriate Government emission conversion factors for greenhouse gas company reporting².

Scope 1 and Scope 2 emissions have been reported in accordance with SECR requirements, and the required subset of Scope 3 emissions have been reported in accordance with the published reporting standard for Carbon Reduction Plans and the Corporate Value Chain (Scope 3) Standard³.
