IMO - MEPC-ES 2

(MEPC-ES 2) took place from 14th to 17th October, chaired by Dr Harry Conway and attended by 135 delegations. Key takeaways of this meeting include: 1. A proposal to establish a new GHG Sub-Committee was agreed in principle by the MEPC-ES 2 member States, and a final decision will be taken at a future session after consideration by the Council and Secretariat. 2. MEPC-ES 2 was tabled to consider several already approved amendments to MARPOL Annex VI with a view to adoption at this session. 3. The proposed adoption of a new Chapter 5 to MARPOL Annex VI called 'Regulation on the IMO Net-Zero Framework' (NZF) was intensely debated and promoted divided opinions among member States. 4. A roll call vote was motioned "to adjourn this MEPC Extraordinary Session for one year". The member States voted to adjourn the meeting. Consequently, the proposed amendments to MARPOL Annex VI were not adopted at this meeting. **View Article**
