_____ John 15:1	I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener.
_____ John 15:2	He cuts off every branch in Me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit He prunes so that it will be even more fruitful.
_____ John 15:3	You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you.
_____ John 15:4	Remain in Me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in Me.
_____ John 15:5	I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in Me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from Me you can do nothing.
_____ John 15:6	If you do not remain in Me, you are like a branch that is thrown away and withers; such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned.
_____ John 15:7	If you remain in Me and My words remain in you, ask whatever you wish and it will be done for you.
_____ John 15:8	This is to My Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be My disciples.
_____ John 15:9	As the Father has loved Me, so have I loved you. Now remain in My love.
_____ John 15:10	If you keep My commands, you will remain in My love, just as I have kept my Father's commands and remain in His love.
_____ John 15:11	I have told you this so that My joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete.
_____ John 15:12	My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you.
_____ John 15:13	Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends.

_____ Phil. 3:13	Brothers and sisters, I do not consider myself yet to have taken hold of it. But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead.
_____ Phil. 3:14	I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus.

_____ Col. 3:5	Put to death, therefore, whatever belongs to your earthly nature: sexual immorality, impurity, lust, evil desires and greed, which is idolatry.
_____ Col. 3:6	Because of these, the wrath of God is coming.

_____ Col. 3:8	But now you must also rid yourselves of all such things as these: anger, rage, malice, slander, and filthy language from your lips.

_____ Col. 3:10	And have put on the new self, which is being renewed in the knowledge in the image of its Creator.
_____ Col. 3:11	Here there is no Gentile or Jew, circumcised or uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave or free, but Christ is all and is in all.
_____ Col. 3:12	Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience.
_____ Col. 3:13	Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you.

_____ Heb. 12:6	Because the Lord disciplines the one He loves, and He chastens everyone He accepts as His son."

_____ Heb. 12:11	No discipline seems pleasant at the time, but painful. Later on, however, it produces a harvest of righteousness and peace for those who have been trained by it.
_____ 2 Tim. 3:12	In fact, everyone who wants to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted.
