


Age 3-5


Age 6-8

Big Welsh Challenge






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Maths Minions



<u>Activities to try at home</u>

<u>Nursery - Reception: Christmas Counting</u> <u>Challenge</u>

Count how many baubles are on your tree How many crackers? How many chocolates? Keep a tally!

Y1 - Y3: Santa's Measurement Mission
Estimate and measure different lengths of tinsel from the Christmas tree, and compare which pieces are longer or shorter. Can you predict the longest piece before you check?"

Y4 - Y6: 12 Days of Xmas Challenge
In the 12 Days of Christmas, the gifts increase each day. On Day 4 the singer gets 4 calling birds plus all the gifts from the earlier days. How many gifts are given by Day 4 altogether? Now work out how many gifts have been given in total from Day 1 to the full twelve days!

12 Magic Number

12 - The twelve days of Christmas represent the time it took for the wise men to travel to Jesus after his birth

31 - This number is special in December because it's the last day of the year, when we celebrate New Year's Eve and get ready for a fresh start!
