- This means Title I funds are used to upgrade the entire educational program to benefit all students in the school.
- We use a Comprehensive Needs Assessment to identify areas for support.
- The Title I staff provide targeted, supplemental reading and math intervention for students in Grades K-5 who need additional support.
- Title I also funds materials and resources for intervention and remediation purposes, family engagement events, curriculum materials, professional development, and more.

- Classroom performance and teacher recommendations.
- Title I services are flexible and focused on meeting current academic needs.





Under Title I, you have the right to:


Under Title I, you have the right to:

POLICY



A. DEFINITION OF PARENT AND FAMILY ENGAGEMENT

For the purposes of this policy, the term "parent and family engagement" means the participation of parents learning and other school activities. To facilitate these the school will:

- Provide and communicate opportunities for volunteerism through the school website, newsletter personal phone messages, social media and other mass communication means.
- Offer engagement opportunities for community based volunteers.
- · Provide the opportunity for parents to participate in student-led conferences to share student
- academic and social progress two times a year. Provide parents the opportunity to participate in parent-teacher conferences once a year.
- Maintain accurate information that is easily accessible in person or via digital means regarding school data and how it relates to student learning.

PURPOSE AND OPERATION OF TITLE 1 PROGRAM

The Title 1 program is a federally supported program that offers assistance to educationally and economically disadvantaged children to help ensure they receive an equitable, high-quality, well-rounded education that will help them meet challenging academic standards. The Title 1 Program will support the learning of all students regardless of their economic status.

The student must meet the following criteria for intervention services to begin:

- a. Students who are most in need of educational help (regardless of family income) b. Specific students who have been identified as failing, or at risk of failing, to
- meet state academic achievement standards
