## Trusting God In the Face of Worry

Matthew 6:27-34

Worry is a universal human experience. Whether it's concern over finances, health, relationships, or the future, anxiety often feels like a persistent companion. But Jesus, in His Sermon on the Mount, gently and clearly reminds us of a profound truth: *worry is powerless*. It cannot add to our lives—it only steals from them.

Jesus asks a rhetorical question in verse 27, "Which of you by being anxious can add a single hour to his span of life?" The obvious answer is none of us. This simple truth exposes our illusion of control and calls us to something better—trust in the sovereign care of our Heavenly Father.

This passage urges us to surrender anxiety not only emotionally but also theologically. We rely not on fate or chance but on a personal God who knows our needs before we ask (v. 32), who provides for the birds and lilies, and who pledges to care for His children even more.

Our Heavenly Father governs all creation, yet He is deeply involved in the lives of His people. Therefore, Jesus' words are not an invitation to laziness or irresponsibility but a call to faith-filled obedience. We are urged to "seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness" (v. 33), trusting that as we prioritize God's rule and His values, He will faithfully provide what we need.


To seek God's kingdom means orienting every part of life—our work, family, finances, and future - under His lordship. This is not a call to do more, but to live with an unshakable conviction that Christ reigns, and that His purposes are worth more than temporal security.

In verse 34, Jesus urges us not to worry about tomorrow. We believe that every day is a gift from God and that the Christian life is lived out daily in the power of the Holy Spirit. Tomorrow belongs to the Lord; our responsibility is to trust and obey Him today.

What specific worries are weighing you down? What truths about your heavenly Father's character from this passage can help you trust Him more fully, and how can you actively pursue God's kingdom in areas of worry?


# Senior Adult


