

If anyone was corresponding with the late VIRGINIA KENNEDY MOREY of Littleton, CO about the Kerrick/Carrick line, please contact her daughter KAREN MOREY KENNEDY, 1 Brookview Circle, Randolph, NJ 07869.

New member HEATHER KENNEDY, Centerville OH offers some of her ancestry for those who might have a connection. Her father was WELLINGTON WATERLOO KENNEDY III, 1906-1995; his father was JOHN ARMSTRONG KENNEDY, ca. 1880-1941. His father was WELLINGTON WATERLOO KENNEDY who migrated ca 1885 from Dumfrieshire and a few years later sent for his wife and many children. They lived in Red Bank, NJ where he was a nurseryman.

JOHN B. KENNEDY of Windsor, Ontario asks for help to trace the family of his father. They were British citizens living in Calcutta, India in the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. His father, PERCIVAL CLAUDE KENNEDY was born in Calcutta in 1887. PERCIVAL's father was born there in 1850, but JOHN has not been able to learn the Christian name of his grandfather. Could anyone please help? There seems to have been quite a large group of Kennedys in India during that period.

#### THE LOCHABER KENNEDIES

With the report about the Kennedys of Galloway, our Chieftain JOHN A KENNEDY, CD, FSA Scot has submitted a report on the Kennedys of Lochaber. From material sub-

mitted by member J. PAUL KENNEDY and others, we have this information about the Lochaber Kennedys. Rumor has it that the Kennedys were brought to Lochaber by Robert the Bruce. But, historically, Ulric Kennedy fled Ayrshire after getting into trouble with the law. Possibly thirty or forty followers left with him. They went north into the wilds of Lochaber. Some of them joined with the Camerons, but others went with the Glengarry family of Clan Donald. They were numerous at one time, with no less than two hundred and forty baptisms recorded on the registers at Kilmallie and Kilmonivaig between 1773 and 1860. It is said, the Glengarry family always had more confidence in the Kennedys than in the MacDonalds of that clan. The Kennedys from Skye and other districts of the Highlands trace their descent from this branch of Kennedys. At one time this group was known as Clan Ulric; however that designation did not last long. The Lochaber Kennedys in times of troubles joined forces with the MacDonells, the MacPhersons and the Camerons. Which is why to this day, clans Cameron and MacDonald claim the Kennedys!

Tradition held by the Kennedys in Lochaber, is that Clunes belonged to them at one time. It is said that Donald, 2nd son of Allan Cameron, 4th of Erracht, in a cunning maneuver obtained the charter for Clunes from Sophia, the wife of Kennedy of Clunes. That is how the first Cameron came to own Clunes. Almost to prove something is wrong is that the burial place at Clunes is used exclusively for Kennedys and Camerons. The Kennedys of Lochaber were loyal followers of the MacDonalds of Glengarry. The MacDonalds recorded that they had fifty Kennedys with them, guarding the pass at Corrieyairack, at the outset of the '45 campaign. In another writeup on Culloden, it is listed that fourteen Kennedys were killed from one area. In another, it is said a fourteen year old boy named Archibald Kennedy came out of the shop where he was employed to watch the battle. He was killed by Cumberland's troops, as no male persons were spared immediately after the battle.

After the battle of Drumossie Moor, (Culloden) accounts of what ensued vary according to the point of view of the narrator. It is said that the Prince gave way to utter panic when he realized the disaster that had overtaken him. What is

certain is that someone, possibly Major Kennedy (Lochiel Cameron's old uncle) seized his horse's bridle and led him off the field. The following is a partial list of the Kennedys and place of residence, who were of Prince Charlie's army (all surnamed Kennedy).

**TRIBUTE TO THE UNITED STATES**

This came from a Canadian newspaper and is worth sharing. Widespread but openly partial news coverage was given recently to a remarkable editorial broadcast from Toronto by Gordon Sinclair, a Canadian television Commentator. These remarks were printed in the Congressional Record.

**AMERICA, THE GOOD NEIGHBOR**

"This Canadian thinks it is time to speak up for the Americans as the most generous and possibly the least appreciated people on all the earth. Germany, Japan and, to a lesser extent, Britain and Italy were lifted out of the debris of war by the Americans who poured in billions of dollars and forgave other billions in debts. None of these countries is today paying even the interest on its remaining debts to the United States.
