It is rather extraordinary to be a Finnish company whose products are actually made in Finland. Equally rare is to be a small operator that owns its own production—in our case, the weaving mill itself, where every weave is the work of our own.

“For a while now we have focused on themes of originality with our design team. While designing the new collection, we started to ponder how the weaving of patterned textiles even came to be—and would you know it, it began with stripes. The very first patterns on woven textiles were stripes. This realisation led us to incorporate a lot of stripes into our new collection, which naturally led our thoughts towards the sea and beach life.”

The new collection features gorgeous new textiles and colours from acclaimed designers such as Elina Helenius, Armi Teva, minä perhonen’s Akira Minagawa as well as Lapuan Kankurit’s in-house design team.

Lapuan Kankurit is a wool and linen weaving mill. Approximately 50% of the company’s revenue comes from exports. Lapuan Kankurit has retailers in over 20 countries. In addition, the company operates its own online store, along with shops in Helsinki, Lapua, and Tokyo.

Behind their success are innovative products and a strong belief in their craft. The main materials used are Finnish natural fibres — linen and wool — as well as new, modern materials.

The weaving mill, known for its transparent production, is constantly evolving to stay competitive on a global scale. Their vertical production line enables them to design both products and processes with a as minimal ecological footprint as possible.

Lapuan Kankurit is dedicated to preserving Finland’s weaving tradition for future generations. Their sustainable designs are the result of work by top industry professionals and close collaboration with TAMK and Aalto University. Lapuan Kankurit continues to pass on textile craftsmanship skills to future generations.

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
