Dear Friends,

October is here, and with it comes a season that often stirs something deeper in all of us. It is Domestic Violence Awareness Month, and as I reflect on the road we have walked together, I am filled with gratitude for each of you who has chosen to stand with us in this work.

In just a few weeks, we will come together for Dancing with the Shasta Stars on October 18th. If you've been before, you know this event is more than a fundraiser. It's a celebration of courage, of healing, and of what happens when a community shows up for its most vulnerable. I am so thankful for the incredible Stars who are already pouring their hearts into this effort. It means more than they know.

At the same time, I am working closely with Signature Healthcare and the Shasta Health Assessment Redesign Collaborative on a regional proposal for the state's Behavioral Health Continuum Infrastructure Program. This application is due on October 28th, and it carries with it the hope of real, lasting change for those navigating mental health and substance abuse challenges in our rural communities. It is a heavy lift, but an important one, and one I am

honored to help lead.

We are in a season of both growth and transition. Our team is expanding, and if you know someone seeking meaningful work in a place where they can truly make a difference, we'd love for you to point them our way. Alongside this growth, we are navigating challenges following a recent flood at the Sierra Center. This has limited access to parts of our building, including our intake area. While we are working diligently to minimize disruption, the full impact is still being assessed.

Whether you donate, attend an event, share our mission, or simply show kindness to someone in need, please know it matters. Every act of support, large or small, helps build a future rooted in safety, dignity, and hope. Thank you for being part of this work. Thank you for trusting us with it.

Every October, we recognize Domestic Violence Awareness Month. This is not just a date on the calendar. It is a movement to bring voice to survivors, to break the silence that allows abuse to continue, and to call our community into action. Domestic violence does not stay behind closed doors. It ripples through families, children, workplaces, and entire communities. Its effects are lasting, but so is the hope that comes when people choose to respond together.

The theme for 2025 is **Safety. Support. Solidarity. Here for survivors, always.** These words reflect the heart of our work across both One SAFE Place and Arch Collaborative. Safety is offered in our emergency shelter, where up to 40 individuals at a time may find refuge. Support is found through counseling, legal advocacy, medical care, housing navigation, and case management that help survivors and their families rebuild their lives. **Solidarity is the community standing shoulder to shoulder, showing survivors that they are not alone.** This is why we are here. This is why we will always be here.

Each day, we witness resilience. A mother and her children arrive with nothing but the clothes on their backs, and they find warmth, security, and compassion. A survivor silenced by years of abuse finally sits across from someone who listens and believes. A child who has endured trauma begins to laugh again through the support of counseling. **These are not just stories. They are lives being restored, step by step, because a community chose to care.**

Domestic Violence Awareness Month matters because silence allows abuse to continue. When we speak out, we shine light into the darkness. When we act, by learning the signs, sharing resources, volunteering, or giving, we extend a hand to someone who may feel alone. Every act of compassion, no matter how small, becomes part of a much larger story of healing and change.

This month, we are asking you to take the next step with us. Share what you know with a friend or coworker. Attend an event. Volunteer your time. Make a gift that ensures a survivor has a safe place to sleep tonight. Become an advocate in your own circle by refusing to let silence win. Look for us throughout the community as we share education and resources, highlight the voices of staff doing the work, and honor the extraordinary courage of survivors.

Together, we can create a future marked by safety, sustained by support, and strengthened through solidarity. Here for survivors, always.

A MAJOR STEP FORWARD: NORTH STATE COALITION SEEKS STATE FUNDS FOR REGIONAL BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CENTER







We are excited to share that Arch Collaborative, One SAFE Place, Signature Healthcare, and SHARC, along with county leaders across the region, are collaborating to bring a regional behavioral health center to the North State. Our CEO, Kimberly Johnson, is leading the proposal submission to California's Behavioral Health Continuum Infrastructure Program. If awarded, this proposal would bring a significant financial investment into our community.

The proposed campus will provide urgently needed services, including crisis stabilization, inpatient psychiatric care, detox services, and urgent care beds. Too often, individuals in crisis are left with only two options: the emergency room or the county jail. This project aims to change that by providing access to immediate, compassionate, and effective care close to home.

Signature Healthcare will play a pivotal role in operating the facility, bringing clinical expertise and experience to ensure that services are delivered with excellence and compassion. With Signature's leadership, the center will provide the highest standard of care while addressing a critical shortage of behavioral health resources in our region. If approved, this center will expand treatment capacity, ease the strain on hospitals and law enforcement, and bring hope to families who are desperate for solutions. It represents a once-in-a-generation opportunity to transform the future of behavioral health care in the North State.
