MAKE IT Barking is a hybrid coworking space and creative hub focusing on creating the conditions to help SMEs and social entrepreneurs flourish.

Since opening mid 2022, by December 2024 it has become home to 69 (and rapidly rising!) diverse SMEs, primarily from East London and Barking & Dagenham. These SMEs span sectors such as beauty, tech, social enterprises, music, film, entertainment, fashion, and more. The space serves as a hub for change-makers, creatives, entrepreneurs and businesses, fostering an atmosphere aimed at unlocking the great potential of Barking & Dagenham.

MAKE IT Barking features five floors of dedicated studio spaces, including meeting rooms, a wellness studio, a photography studio and an event space. Additionally, it houses Factory 15, an on-site bar and events venue, enhancing the community experience and providing a vibrant environment for collaboration and innovation.
