The National **Jubilee Pilgrimage of Hope** marks the Church's Holy Year of 2025, with pilgrims setting out from the Catholic cathedrals in Cardiff, Leeds, Norwich and Southwark. Day pilgrims are very welcome to join them along the way. The stages in Nottingham Diocese take in the stops listed below. Please check availability and book your place by 21 August.

Whether you walk or not, you are warmly invited to welcome the pilgrims to our mother church and enjoy a fitting celebration of the Jubilee Year.

- St Luke's Way from Norwich via Wisbech (9 September), Spalding, Bourne, Grantham and Bingham
- St Mark's Way from Leeds via Padley Chapel (10 September), Matlock, Ripley and Eastwood
- St John's Way from London via Market Harborough (10 September), Belton-in-Rutland, Melton Mowbray, Keyworth
- St Matthew's Way from Cardiff via Burton-on-Trent (12 Sept) and Long Eaton.
