2 The Table of Liturgical Days

In order to determine which celebration should be celebrated, especially when a parish has a proper celebration (eg patronal solemnity, consecration of the church) which coincides with another liturgical celebration, the table below (taken from the Universal Norms for the Liturgical Year and the Calendar, with thanks to the National Liturgy Office) should be followed.

Group One

1. The Paschal Triduum of the Passion and Resurrection of the Lord.
2. The Nativity of the Lord (Christmas Day) , the Epiphany, the Ascension, and Pentecost.
Sundays of Advent, Lent, and Easter.
Ash Wednesday.
Weekdays of Holy Week from Monday up to and including Thursday.
Days within the octave of Easter.
3. Solemnities inscribed in the General Calendar, whether of the Lord, of the Blessed Virgin Mary or of saints.
The Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed (All Souls Day).
4. Proper solemnities, namely:
 - a. The solemnity of the principal patron of the place, city or state.
 - b. The solemnity of the dedication and of the anniversary of the dedication of one's own church.
 - c. The solemnity of the Title of one's own church.
 - d. The solemnity either of the title, or of the founder, or of the principal patron of an Order or Congregation.

Group Two

5. Feasts of the Lord inscribed in the General Calendar.
6. Sundays of Christmas Time and the Sundays in Ordinary Time.
7. Feasts of the Blessed Virgin Mary and of the saints in the General Calendar.
8. Proper feasts, namely:
 - a. The feast of the principal patron of the Diocese.
 - b. The feast of the anniversary of the dedication of the cathedral church.

- c. The feast of the principal patron of a region or province, or a country, or of a wider territory.
 - d. The feast of the title, founder, or principal patron of an Order or Congregation and of a religious province, without prejudice to the prescriptions given under no. 4.
 - e. Other feasts proper to an individual church.
 - f. Other feasts inscribed in the calendar of each Diocese or Order or Congregation.
9. Weekdays of Advent from 17th December up to and including 24th December.
Days within the octave of Christmas.
Weekdays of Lent.

Group Three

10. Obligatory memorials in the General Calendar.
11. Proper obligatory memorials, namely:
- a. The memorial of a secondary patron of the place, Diocese, region, or religious province.
 - b. Other obligatory memorials inscribed in the calendar of each Diocese, or Order or Congregation.
12. Optional memorials, which, however, may be celebrated, in the special manner described in the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) and of the Liturgy of the Hours, even on the days listed in no. 9.
In the same manner obligatory memorials may be celebrated as optional memorials if they happen to fall on Lenten weekdays.
13. Weekdays of Advent up to and including 16th December inclusive.
Weekdays of Christmas Time from 2nd January until the Saturday after the Epiphany.
Weekdays of Easter Time from Monday after the octave of Easter up to and including the Saturday before Pentecost.
Weekdays in Ordinary Time.

If several celebrations fall on the same day, the one that holds the highest rank according to the Table of Liturgical Days is observed. However, a solemnity impeded by a liturgical day that takes precedence over it should be transferred to the closest day not listed under nos. 1-8 in the Table of Precedence, provided that what is laid down in no. 5 is observed. As to the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord, whenever it falls on any day of Holy Week, it shall always be transferred to the Monday after the Second Sunday of Easter. Other celebrations are omitted in that year.

Should on the other hand, Vespers (evening prayer) of the current day's Office and First Vespers (evening prayer I) of the following day be assigned for celebration on the same day, then Vespers (evening prayer) of the celebration with the higher rank in the Table of Liturgical Days takes precedence; in cases of equal rank, Vespers (evening prayer) of the current day takes precedence.

3 Solemnities of Obligation (Canon 1246)

In the Dioceses of England and Wales, when the solemnities of the Epiphany, Saints Peter and Paul, the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, or All Saints fall on a Saturday or Monday, the solemnity is to be observed and the precept discharged on the Sunday. With effect from the First Sunday of Advent 2017 the Epiphany of the Lord was restored to 6th January (except when it falls on a Saturday or Monday, as above) and the Ascension of the Lord to the Thursday after the Sixth Sunday of Easter. The solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is celebrated on the Sunday following Trinity Sunday. The solemnity of the Nativity of the Lord is always celebrated on 25th December.

Following a Note from the Dicastery for Divine Worship and Discipline of the Sacraments, issued on 23rd January about 'the obligation to attend Mass when a holyday of obligation is transferred because of an *occurentia festorum* (ie the coincidence of two feast days on the same calendar date)' the direction given is that 'it is to be considered liturgical law (cf. Canon 2) that in the event of the occasional transfer of a holyday of obligation, the obligation to attend Mass is not transferred to the day *ad quem*'. In practice this means that where a solemnity of obligation falls is transferred to a Sunday, there is only an obligation to attend Mass once, for the Sunday and solemnity combined, and not twice (once for each celebration). It would seem that this *dubia* doesn't exist when the solemnity of obligation falls on a Sunday, since the Sunday celebration (and its ensuing obligation) is suppressed by the law itself.

Different arrangements apply in churches and chapels pertaining to the Bishopric of the Forces.

4 Masses for Sundays and Holydays anticipated the previous evening, and Vigil Masses

Mass celebrated on the evening before a Sunday or solemnity may be that appointed for the day itself, or for the Sunday or solemnity following, in which case it is a Mass in Anticipation. Some solemnities have proper Vigil Masses, which, if a Mass is celebrated on the evening before the solemnity, must be celebrated.

The solemnities with proper Vigil Masses are:

- The Nativity of the Lord
- The Epiphany of the Lord
- Easter
- The Ascension of the Lord
- Pentecost
- The Nativity of Saint John the Baptist
- Saints Peter and Paul
- The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Each has prayers and Readings proper to the Vigil, and different prayers and Readings proper to the Mass of the Day. Christmas has four proper Masses (Vigil, Night, Dawn, Day); Easter has an extended Vigil Mass with eight Readings before the Gospel; Pentecost has an extended Vigil Mass with five Readings before the Gospel. The Easter Vigil should not begin before nightfall and should end before dawn.

When the Mass of an anticipated Sunday or solemnity falls on a solemnity, the Mass to be celebrated is determined by the higher rank indicated in the table of liturgical days given at the front of The Roman Missal. For the good of the faithful it is always permissible to celebrate the Mass of the Sunday in preference to the solemnity.

5 Celebrating the Anniversary of the Consecration of the Church

For those churches which have been consecrated, the annual celebration of the church's consecration takes place on the day on which the church was consecrated. For those churches for which this date is known, a note is made in the Ordo and this celebration takes precedence over any other celebrations on that day. Where the date isn't known, but the church has been consecrated, the celebration is kept on 22nd October each year.

The anniversary is celebrated with the rank of solemnity:

White: At Mass: Gloria, Readings of the solemnity, Creed, Preface of the Dedication of a Church

The prayers are taken from the Roman Missal pp.1091-1097; the readings are taken from the Lectionary numbers 701-706: volume II, pp.931-949; or volume III, pp.1239-1256; for convenience the readings may be taken from those given for the feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica, 9th November (Lectionary number 671: volume I, pp.1017-1020; or volume III, pp.1213-1216). There are always two Readings proclaimed before the Gospel.

6 Celebrating the Church's Patron or Title on Sunday

The celebration of the church's patron saint or title (of the Trinity, of Our Lord, or of Our Lady) may be transferred from a weekday to a Sunday provided the following conditions are fulfilled:

- The patron saint or title has the favour of popular devotion
- The Sunday to which it is transferred is a Sunday 'of the year' (in ordinary time)
- The church has been consecrated

If the above conditions are fulfilled, all Masses at which a congregation is present on that Sunday may be Masses of the patron saint or title.

Whenever the patron saint or title is celebrated (either on the appointed day or when transferred to the Sunday) it is celebrated with the rank of solemnity:

White: At Mass: Gloria, Readings of the solemnity, Creed, Preface of the solemnity

The readings are taken from those given in the Lectionary, with the addition of a second reading (if one isn't already provided) from the common readings; the prayers are taken from the Roman Missal.

7 Ritual Masses, Masses for Various Needs and Occasions, Votive Masses, and Masses for the Dead

The following table of rubrics governs when celebrations using the formularies from Ritual Masses, Masses for Various Needs and Occasions, Votive Masses, and Masses for the Dead are permitted within the liturgical year. With thanks to the National liturgy Office.

- V1** Ritual Masses (General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) 372). Masses for various needs and occasions and votive Masses, in cases of serious need or pastoral advantage, at the direction of the local Ordinary or with his permission (GIRM 374).
- V2** Masses for various needs and occasions and votive Masses, in cases of serious need or pastoral advantage, at the discretion of the rector of the church or the priest celebrant (GIRM 376).
- V3** Masses for various needs and occasions and votive Masses chosen by the priest celebrant in favour of the devotion of the people (GIRM 373, 375).
- D1** Funeral Mass (GIRM 380).
- D2** Mass on the occasion of news of a death, final burial, or the first anniversary (GIRM 381).
- D3** Daily Mass for the dead (GIRM, no. 381). When D1 and D2 are not permitted, neither is D3.

9 Cycle of Prayer

From earliest times rogation and ember days have been days of prayer for particular needs or in thanksgiving. Since 1972, in their place, the Bishops' Conference has included Days of special prayer, and from Advent 1996 a single Cycle of Prayer. The Cycle divides the year into six periods: Advent/Christmas, Lent, Easter, and three periods of Ordinary Time: winter, summer and autumn. We pray for certain intentions throughout each period, as shown in the notes at the beginning of each period. At Mass on the Days of special prayer it is sufficient to announce the Day during the opening remarks, and to include a suitable petition in the intercessions.

10 Holy Father's Prayer Intentions

The Holy Father, Pope Leo, has entrusted an intention for each month of the year to his worldwide prayer network. The intentions are printed in the Ordo on the first day of each month; for ease they are also given below:

December 2025 – For Christians in areas of conflict. Let us pray that Christians living in areas of war or conflict, especially in the Middle East, might be seeds of peace, reconciliation, and hope.

January 2026 – For prayer with the Word of God. Let us pray that praying with the Word of God be nourishment for our lives and a source of hope in our communities, helping us to build a more fraternal and missionary Church.

February – For children with incurable diseases. Let us pray that children suffering from incurable diseases and their families receive the necessary medical care and support, never losing strength and hope.

March – For disarmament and peace. Let us pray that nations move toward effective disarmament, particularly nuclear disarmament, and that world leaders choose the path of dialogue and diplomacy instead of violence.

April – For priests in crisis. Let us pray for priests going through moments of crisis in their vocation, that they may find the accompaniment they need and that communities may support them with understanding and prayer.

May – That everyone might have food. Let us pray that everyone, from large producers to small consumers, be committed to avoid wasting food, and to ensure that everyone has access to quality food.

June – For the values of sports. Let us pray that sports be an instrument of peace, encounter, and dialogue among cultures and nations, and that they promote values such as respect, solidarity, and personal growth.

July – For respect for human life. Let us pray for the respect and protection of human life in all its stages, recognizing it as a gift from God.

August – For evangelization in the city. Let us pray that in large cities often marked by anonymity and loneliness we find new ways to proclaim the Gospel, discovering creative paths to build community.

September – For the care of water. Let us pray for a just and sustainable management of water, a vital resource, so that everyone may have equal access to it.

October – For mental health ministry. Let us pray that the mental health ministry be established throughout the Church, helping to overcome the stigma and discrimination of persons with mental illnesses.

November – For the proper use of wealth. Let us pray for the proper use of wealth, that not succumbing to the temptation of selfishness, it may always be put at the service the common good and solidarity of those who have less.

December – For single-parent families. Let us pray for families experiencing the absence of a mother or father, that they may find support and accompaniment in the Church, and help and strength in the Faith during difficult times.

11 At Mass

Sundays: Gloria (except in Advent or Lent); Readings of the Sunday; Creed; Preface of Sundays; vestments of the colour of the Sunday; one Mass to be offered by parish priests as *Missa Pro Populo*.

Solemnities of Obligation: Gloria; Readings of the solemnity; Creed; Preface of the solemnity; vestments of the colour of the solemnity; one Mass to be offered by parish priests as *Missa Pro Populo*.

Solemnities: Gloria; Readings of the solemnity; Creed; Preface of the solemnity; vestments of the colour of the solemnity.

Feasts: Gloria; Readings of the feast; no Creed; Preface of the feast; vestments of the colour of the feast.

Memorials and Optional Memorials: no Gloria; Readings of the weekday (except where there are proper Readings for the memorial being celebrated; or where there are proper Readings for the optional memorial and this is being celebrated). For pastoral reasons, other Readings may be chosen, such as those suggested in the Lectionary for saints on memorials, or Readings which are more appropriate to pupils for the celebration of a primary school Mass, provided that the cycle of weekday Readings is followed in the main; no Creed; Common Preface or of the memorial; vestments of the colour of the memorial.

Commemorations: no Gloria; Readings of the season; no Creed; Preface of the season; vestments of the colour of the season.

Other considerations: the Gloria and the Creed may always be included when Mass is celebrated on special occasions, and at such a Mass the vestments may always be of the colour of the celebration, rather than the day or season, except for Requiem Masses when violet vestments (or black, or white) are used.

Episcopal Celebrations: at Masses during which the Sacrament of Confirmation is conferred the guidance provided by Bishop's House is followed. Likewise at Masses during which the Sacrament of Ordination is conferred, or for other particular Masses celebrated by the Bishop of Nottingham, advice should be sought in good time from Bishop's House.

12 Nuptial Masses

Except on Sundays and solemnities the Nuptial Mass (with white vestments) may be celebrated in full. On Sundays and solemnities the Mass of the day is celebrated, with the nuptial blessing and, if opportune, the final proper formula of blessing. Even when Nuptial Mass is not permitted, one of the nuptial Readings may be chosen for catechesis, except on the solemnities of the Nativity of the Lord, the Epiphany of the Lord, the days of Holy Week, Easter Day, the days of the Easter Octave, the Ascension of the Lord, Pentecost, the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, Saints Peter and Paul, the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, or All Saints, when the Readings must be those of the solemnity.

13 Masses with Children and Young People

The Bishop issued the Decree given below, on 8th September 2024, requiring the liturgical provisions in the Diocesan **Planning and Celebrating Prayer and Liturgy with Young People** to be used when appropriate.

The Bishops' Conference of England and Wales published, through the Catholic Education Service, the **Prayer and Liturgy Directory** in autumn 2023, as a resource for good practice within the Catholic schools and colleges across England and Wales. Building upon this resource, which is already being implemented within the schools and academies of the Diocese of Nottingham, I recognise that it is further helpful to have some additional and specific guidance in particular areas of the celebration of liturgies and of the Mass within the schools of this diocese.

With all this in mind, and taking nothing from the Prayer and Liturgy Directory, and under my authority as Bishop of Nottingham, I therefore publish this practical and pastoral expression of the Prayer and Liturgy directory, **Planning and Celebrating Prayer and Liturgy with Young People**, for use in all of the schools and academies in the Diocese of Nottingham. It is further to be taken as the pre-eminent resource for planning and celebrating Masses in the parishes of Nottingham Diocese in which a majority of the congregation are of school age.

In this way I hope to foster an ever deeper sense of reverence for the Word of God and for the sacramental life of our diocese, especially in the hearts and minds of those in our school and academy communities. At the same time I hope that this publication will provide a resource which allows all to strive for every more authentic worship of Almighty God, in our schools, academies, and parishes.

Planning and Celebrating Prayer and Liturgy with Young People is to be used in the schools, academies, and (where appropriate) in parishes of the Diocese of Nottingham from 8th September 2024, Education Sunday, and the liturgical memory of the Birthday of Our Blessed Lady.

14 Statement on Marriage

Revised 29th August 2020

By order of the Bishop, the following statement is to be published or read at Masses on at least one of the weekends in each of February and October each year.

Marriage is a lifelong vocation of a man and a woman to a community of life and love open to children, and, between the baptized, it is a Sacrament. Aware of the many pressures today which can endanger family life, the Church is constantly concerned to make sure that those of you planning to marry are prepared as well as possible. We would like to remind those who wish to marry of the following:

1. It is important that a couple go to see their priest in good time before their wedding. Normally, at least six months' notice should be given.
2. Marriage preparation is carried out by the priest, often assisted by a group from the parish. Courses arranged on a Deanery basis are recommended.
3. Catholics are reminded of their obligation to preserve their faith and to do all they can within the unity of their partnership to have all their children baptized and brought up in the faith and practice of the Catholic Church.
4. Non-Catholic partners will be informed of this promise, but they are not asked to make this or any similar promise.
5. Dispensation for a marriage between a Catholic and a non-Catholic to take place in a non-Catholic church can be granted only for a serious reason. Couples who wish to marry in a non-Catholic church should discuss the matter with their priest in good time before their wedding day to see whether a dispensation could be granted.

All couples marrying these days need the support of the local Church. In this way they will be strengthened in their preparation for marriage, in celebrating their marriage, and in living out their covenant with one another.

We wish to thank all those married people who show such constancy and fidelity to their vocation of marriage. May their example inspire those planning to marry in the Church.

The Mass, which is to be celebrated in all parish churches, and in other churches and oratories only where it can be celebrated with dignity and with the participation of a good-sized congregation, is not to begin until evening, unless the Bishop gives permission otherwise

At Mass all is done as in the Roman Missal, pp.330ff. Gloria (during which the church bells may be rung after the intonation, and then silenced until the Easter Vigil); Readings of the Mass of the Lord's Supper; the Creed isn't recited; the Washing of Feet (if it takes place) occurs after the Homily using twelve members of the community; during the Procession of Gifts offerings for the poor may be brought forward; Proper Preface (with proper inserts for Eucharistic Prayer I)

After Holy Communion has been distributed the Blessed Sacrament reserved for Good Friday remains on the altar until after the Prayer after Communion, at which time a Procession is formed to the Chapel of Repose. The Blessed Sacrament is reserved in the tabernacle with adoration during the night, although if this continues after midnight it should be without solemnity

The altar is stripped after Mass is concluded

Office: Vespers need not be said by those present at the Mass of the Lord's Supper; if celebrated publicly violet vestments should be used
