Tomato Classifications

Determinate – Varieties that are bred to grow to a compact height. They stop growing when fruit sets on the terminal or top bud, ripen all their crop at or near the same time (usually over a 2 week period), and then die. Require a limited amount of caging and/or staking.

Indeterminate – They will grow and produce fruit until killed by frost and can reach heights of up to 10 feet although 6 feet is considered the norm. They require substantial caging and/or staking for support and pruning and the removal of suckers is practiced by many but is not mandatory.

Semi-Indeterminate – The growth habit is somewhere in between the true determinate and the true indeterminate tomatoes. They act bushy due to their shorter vines but grow tall enough that they need to be staked.

Determinate tomatoes are shorter (about 4ft tall) while indeterminate tomatoes are taller (6-20ft tall).

Determinate tomatoes stop growing after flowering.

Indeterminate tomatoes keep growing even after flowering.

Scoville Units: The Scoville Scale is a measurement of the pungency (spicy/heat) of peppers generally related to their capsaicin content.
