ELIGIBILITY

Competitors from all divisions that are registered participants of Biathlon Canada or US Biathlon or another IBU national federation for the 2025-2026 season will be eligible to participate. Competitors must be prepared to show a membership card or otherwise prove their membership for the current year as part of the event registration process.

Teams and individual competitors from outside Canada must declare their firearms at the Canadian border, complete the necessary documentation, and pay the required fees when bringing firearms and ammunition into Canada. Please consult the Royal Canadian Mounted Police website and RCMP Form 5589e (rcmp-grc.gc.ca) for Access to the Non-Resident Firearms Declaration.

For Canadian citizens in the categories using a firearm (.22), it is mandatory that all athletes have in their possession and be able to show on request their proof of completion of the Canadian Firearms Safety Course. For the categories carrying the rifle, they must also have in hand the Possession and Acquisition License for firearms or their minor's license, issued by the Government of Canada.

The Quebec Cup is open to all athletes who are registered members of a Biathlon club affiliated with the FQB. Non-members can participate in the races if they are members of another federation and will be eligible for medals but not for Quebec Cup points.

On the sidelines of the event, an Estrie Cup will be held for Estrie members, and registration details will follow in another communication intended for Estrie members only. Other individuals who wish to participate in a trial without being a member of the FQB can register for the Quebec Cup, but they will need to obtain an online license before registering <https://www.biathloncanada.ca/membership>.

Some air rifles or electronic rifles may be available on site, but quantities are limited so arrangements will need to be made in advance with the organizing committee.

New for 2025-2026 season

All coaches will also need to register in Zone4 as previously specified in **order to obtain their pass to the shooting range**.

When registering, they must provide proof that they meet the safety requirements of Biathlon Canada.

They must have completed the three training courses: "Safety Sport Training", "Understanding the Rule of 2" training and "Creating a Positive Sport Environment". Those trainings are available on line in the coach locker (<https://thelocker.coach.ca/>).

They must provide the completion dates of these courses as proof during registration in Zone4.

For coaches from the United States, the completion dates of equivalent courses must be provided.

The organization will determine the athlete's start time. We cannot guarantee that they will start with their age group. When registering, indicate your date of birth, desired course, and the type of rifle used.

Start time:

Scheduled for 11 a.m. every day.

Note: The organization reserves the right to change the start time depending on the weather and the number of registrations.

SANCTION

The competitions are sanctioned by the International Biathlon Union, Biathlon Canada and the FQB and are covered by their insurance.

IBU TRANSPORT AID FUND

As this is an IBU Regional IBU Event, travel grants for eligible athletes under 21 will be provided by the IBU to the participating national federations. Travel grants for Canadian athletes will be sent by Biathlon Canada directly to the athletes' club/team. Contact your club/team for details on how your club/team will manage the travel grants allocated to them. Travel grants for American athletes participating in the event may be provided through the USBA. American athletes should contact the USBA for details on the management of travel grants for IBU regional events.

Athletes in the IBU categories (M, W, Jr M&W, Youth M&W) can check if they are registered with the IBU Member Centre by visiting the IBU Data Centre at <https://www.biathlonresults.com/> and searching for their name. If their name does not appear in the Data Centre when they search, it means they are not registered with the IBU Member Centre.

If a Canadian athlete in an IBU category is not yet registered with the IBU Member Center, Biathlon Canada can register them with the IBU Member Center. If you would like to register, please email a copy of your passport to Sheri Adams-Selinger at sadamsselinger@biathloncanada.ca. Biathlon Canada must receive your passport at least two weeks before the event in order to have enough time to process your application.

Athletes who are members of the US Biathlon or other national federations must contact their national federation to register with the IBU member center if they are not already registered.

AWARDS

Eastern Canadian Championships medals will be awarded for eligible categories according to Biathlon Canada policy

Quebec Cup medals will be awarded to the top three athletes in each open Quebec Cup category according to FQB policy.

There will be no medals for the other categories

WAXING PROTOCOL AND WAXING CLINIC

We are very happy to count UGO SKI SERVICES among our partners. They will be on site all weekend to assist with the waxing process. In addition to providing a high-level waxing protocol, they can help you, answer your questions, and present their products. Don't hesitate to go see them. They are passionate and will be happy to guide you.

The waxing protocol is mandatory for all competitive categories mentioned earlier. Everything will be carried out in collaboration with our partner UGO SKI SERVICES. Skis must be dropped off in the main waxing room. For the Saturday race, they must be submitted between 3:30 PM and 4:30 PM on Friday. For the Sunday race, skis must be submitted between 2:00 PM and 2:30 PM on Saturday. This time may be adjusted depending on the number of registrations and the finish time of the Saturday race.

The skis must be returned scraped. It is possible to apply a structure to the skis before returning them.

The skis will be waxed by the UGO SKI SERVICES team with the help of coaches. Each team will need to provide coaches to assist with the ski waxing process. A schedule will be prepared to assign coaches based on the information provided by the coaches during their registration. This schedule will be confirmed at the team captains' meeting. Coaches who participate in the protocol will receive a souvenir gift at the gala or during the medal ceremony on Sunday.

A waxing clinic will take place on the site over the weekend. The company **UGO SKI SERVICES**, distributor of **Holmenkol** products, will offer us this high-level clinic for free, involving qualified technicians working on the international circuit. The clinic is scheduled for 2:30 PM or immediately after the medal presentation on Saturday. Please indicate your interest in participating when you register so that we have an idea of the space required.

A Fluoro ban is in effect for this event for all competition classes.

BANQUET

A banquet will be held on Saturday at 6:00 PM at the La Patrie municipal hall located at 18 Chartier Street, La Patrie. An all-you-can-eat pasta meal will be served for \$30.

Registration for the banquet is done in Zone 4 when you register, whether you are an athlete, a coach, or a companion.

An alcohol permit has been requested, persons aged 18 and over will be able to purchase wine and certain spirits on site. In accordance with the permit, **only alcohol purchased on site** may be consumed. To help us estimate the required quantities and to ensure you get what you want, you will be able to pre-order your bottle of wine in Zone4 for a fee of 16.50\$.

Fun and surprises on site guaranteed by the organizing committee, don't miss it. The draw for participation prizes for athletes and coaches will take place on site. Attendance required.

MEALS AND FACILITIES

Given the absence of an on-site cafeteria, the organizing committee offers you the opportunity to reserve a lunch box for Saturday and Sunday midday meals. This lunch box, along with hot soup on the side, will be available at a cost of \$15.

Lunch box reservations are made in Zone4 when you register, whether for athletes, coaches, or companions.

We will be happy to offer hot soup to other coaches and athletes. However, out of environmental concern and to minimize event waste, this soup will be provided to people who bring their own bowl and spoon. We will have a limited number of reusable bowls and spoons available on-site for \$2 each, while supplies last.

Hot and cold beverages will also be available for free on site if you bring your own reusable cup or mug. We will have a limited number of reusable cups for hot and/or cold drinks on site for \$1 while supplies last.

In the event the Event is cancelled or postponed the Organizing Committee reserves the right to retain all or part of the registration fees to cover expenses incurred.

Notes

Minimum registration of 4 athletes for the opening of a category. Athlete can compete anyway in the category but with no medals.

Air rifles Categories: The athlete does not carry the rifle during the event. Shots will be made in the prone position only. The penalty ring is 100 meters. Weights are not provided. A heated area will be available near the shooting range to warm up rifles as needed. For Boys and Girls initiation, a 20-second penalty per missed target will be added to the race time as there will be no penalty magnifying glass for these categories.

Participants in the open participatory category will not have medals and no points will be accumulated in the Quebec Cup standings.

The races are recognized by the Quebec Biathlon Federation and points will be awarded for the 2025-2026 Quebec Cup ranking in accordance with the organizational policy

PROTEST

Protests will be prepared and submitted to the competition secretariat.

A deposit of \$50.00 will be required at the time of filing the protest. It can be made in cash or by bank transfer to infobiathlonestrie@gmail.com.

The amount will be refunded for any protest granted by the competition jury.

RULES

The event will follow the rules of:

- IBU Rules 2025.
- FQB Biathlon Event Organization Policy, November 2019
- Canadian Hosting Policy 2025
- During competitions, Junior Boys and Girls (U15) and Juveniles Boys and Girls (U13) will have to shoot at targets with a diameter of 15 mm, U13 will be allowed to use a support. Athletes aged 10 years old and under (U11) will be able to benefit from support and will use 35mm diameter targets.




