Background:

Proposition 28 Annual Reports – FY 2025-26

Proposition 28 (Arts and Music in Schools Funding Guarantee and Accountability Act) provides ongoing, restricted funding to expand arts and music education in TK–12 schools. Funds must supplement, not supplant, existing arts programs; are subject to an 80% staffing requirement for LEAs over 500 ADA; and are capped at 1% for administrative costs.

Education Code §8823 requires each charter school to prepare an annual public report describing how Prop 28 funds were used and to submit the report to the California Department of Education in the manner prescribed. Board approval is required before posting and submission. This item is an informational compliance filing for each school.

The FY 2025-26 Annual Reports for Classical Academy, Classical Academy High, Classical Academy Vista, and Coastal Academy Charter have been completed and are attached for Board approval.

Action Required by the Board:

Approve the FY 2025-26 Proposition 28 Annual Reports for Classical Academy, Classical Academy High, Classical Academy Vista, and Coastal Academy Charter, and authorize staff to submit the approved reports to the California Department of Education in the manner prescribed.

In the 2025-26 school year, with support from Prop 28, we expanded arts program by offering an Intermediate Art elective to M track students and adding art classes to A/B track students led by a credentialed arts teacher. Students worked with a range of media, including graphite, colored pencil, paint, scratchboard, and papier-mâché, building skills in drawing, texture, and three-dimensional design. These projects were proudly featured at our annual Spring Art Fair, celebrating student voice, creativity, and artistic growth.

In the 2025-26 school year, with support from Prop 28, we significantly expanded our TK-8 arts program, increasing student access to a wide range of artistic disciplines, including ceramics, visual arts, music, musical theater, drama, and photography. Adding instructional aides in classrooms has provided personalized support, allowing more students to engage deeply with their creative interests.
