Uplifting


By going to a Judge in the Family Court. Oranga Tamariki can gain certain powers backed by the law

Oranga Tamariki Act 1989



at your door... You can ask:

Can I see your I.D?

Sections 39(3) and 49

Support

You have a right to have someone on your side who has knowledge to help your whanau through the process

You can ask:

Can we have a support person?

Sections 5(1)(a), 11(2)(a)

Access to information

Your whanau have a right to know why Oranga Tamariki are investigating you

Section 8

A Whanau Situation

Your whanau has a right to: be heard and to tell your side of the story.

Take the lead in the Family Group Conference

Section 5(c)(v)

Your Tamariki

Your tamariki are important and have a right to have their voices heard.

This can include being a part of meetings and having a say in decisions and about their care where age appropriate.

Sections 5(1)(a), 11(2)(a)

Court Orders

As part of a custody order, a Judge may allow or deny certain people contact with your tamariki

Interim Order

Remember: Interim means temporary. Your tamariki can still end up in your care after the order ends.

Draw upon the strength in your whanau and hold out until the Family Group Conference for the sake of your tamariki.



Custody Order

As part of a custody order a Judge may allow or deny particular people contact with your tamariki
