Dear Parent/Carer,

As we approach the end of what has been a long and busy term, I want to take a moment to thank you for your continued support with school attendance. Whilst attendance is steadily improving across the school, but we have noticed a sharp decline over the past couple of weeks. We fully appreciate that this time of year brings the usual challenges of winter coughs, colds, and seasonal illnesses, and that students can be more vulnerable to these during the colder months.
