Throughout the day, students explored a range of texts and topics, using structured talk to deepen their understanding and practise key oracy skills. From forming justified opinions in Period 1 to participating in collaborative Harkness discussions later in the day, students developed their ability to speak clearly, listen actively, and engage thoughtfully with others.

The event concluded with students using the Traverse strategy to reflect on their progress and self-assess their strengths across all four oracy strands: Physical, Linguistic, Cognitive, and Social/Emotional.

Year 7 Oracy Day was a great success, giving students a strong foundation for confident communication and meaningful discussion—skills they will continue to develop throughout their Bishop Young journey.

KS4 TEMPLE NEWSAM TRIP

At Temple Newsam, students explored the grand Tudor-Jacobean mansion and its beautiful grounds, gaining a deeper understanding of the lives of the people who lived and worked there over the centuries. The trip brought the local history curriculum to life, allowing pupils to connect their classroom studies with real historical sites and artefacts.

Through guided tours and interactive activities, students developed key skills in historical inquiry and critical thinking, while deepening their appreciation of the rich heritage that surrounds them.

AIM HIGHER WORKSHOP


