

What is fiber internet?

Fiber internet is the world's fastest internet service. It uses fiberoptic cables.

Fiber internet provides:

- 1 Lightning-fast internet
- 2 Minimal latency
- 3 No bandwidth limitations

Fiber internet is becoming more and more essential as highresolution streaming, remote work and other online activities continue to increase residential internet usage. As more fiber internet infrastructure is built in communities like yours across the United States, this high-speed service is likely to become the new standard for internet in the years ahead.



What kind of speed does fiber offer?

Ting's fiber internet offers upload and download speeds of up to 1 Gbps.

Fiber internet is about 20 times faster than the upload and download speeds offered by cable ISPs.

Most importantly, fiber internet speeds don't slow down during peak periods of usage, whereas cable internet connections do. When you go with fiber, blazing-fast internet speeds will be consistent at any hour of the day or night.





How is fiber internet connected to our community's homes?

Ting's fiber-optic cables are installed via various methods that place the fiber-optic cables underground throughout your community. In addition to providing this infrastructure, Ting will work with each property owner to determine the best location for running fiber cable into their home.

What does a bulk contract for HOAs look like?

To qualify for low rates that make fiber internet a no-brainer for their communities, HOAs can sign a multi-year service contract with Ting Internet. A long-term deal makes it feasible for Ting to build up the fiber infrastructure your community will need for its new high-speed internet service, and it gives your community and its members price security by locking in a fixed rate over the life of that contract.



What kind of deal can HOAs get with bulk pricing?

HOAs looking to upgrade to a faster, better internet service can lock in excellent value by negotiating a bulk rate for community-wide internet service.

Bulk contracts provides hundreds of dollars in *swings* for each community member.



Does Ting offer TV/internet service bundles?



Although Ting doesn't offer TV service as its own service package or as part of a larger bundle with internet, our high-speed internet gives you ultimate flexibility in choosing how you get TV and other media services delivered to your home.

If you have an existing cable TV service bundled with internet, you can simply call your service provider to have internet removed from your account. Alternatively, you can research different cable TV options in your area to see which service package is the best fit for your needs.

In addition, high-speed fiber internet makes it easy to rely on over-the-top streaming services as a supplement or replacement for your cable TV service. Streaming apps like Hulu, for example, offer live streaming of TV channels just like a traditional cable TV service. With high download speeds and fully available bandwidth, you can stream live TV like never before.



What happens if construction in the neighborhood cuts a fiber service line?

Because each home's internet is delivered through fiber-optic cable, any cut to this line will completely stop service to that residence. With some ISPs, you could end up waiting weeks for a technician to come out and repair the outage. In the meantime, you'd be left without any of your devices and activities that rely on an internet connection, which may include essentials beyond TV and entertainment, such as your home's security system or your ability to work from home.

When a fiber line gets cut, Ting knows you need service restored immediately. When Hunter and Sarah Photography, based in Charlottesville, Virginia, had their home office's Ting fiber line cut during a construction project, the married business partners had no way to work, but Ting quickly came out to replace their fiber cable.

Our HOA needs to secure easements and other approvals to run a new service line to our community. Does Ting help with this legal process?

If you're concerned about the complexity of running fiber service to your community, let Ting take care of the bulk of the paperwork. 


