She also did extensive research into the interrelationships between the natural elements of the earth and wrote several books inspired by her love of the earth and its resources. *The Sea Around Us* (Oxford University Press, 1951) presents the philosophy and science of Rachel Carson at her most lyrical, recounting the 5 billion year history of water on earth. Her writing inspired the lyrics to this choral work.
