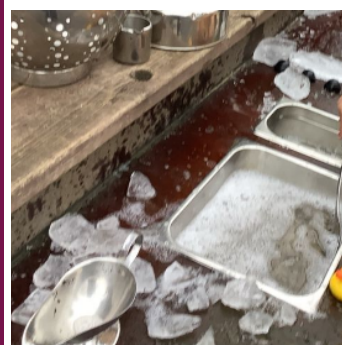
Reception News

The Children’s Commissioner for England has published a guide which aims to support parents with their child’s online safety. ‘What I wish my parents knew’, aims to help parents to recognise the complex and rapidly evolving landscape their children are navigating.

The guide offers parents an insight into what children find hard about having conversations about their online lives, detailed guidance on the issues children said they wanted their parents to better understand. It also includes explainers of the top social media apps and AI tools children use.

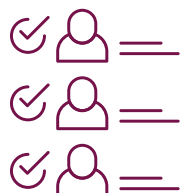
7:30am - Breakfast Club (application only)
