Attendance Matters



Reception Class have loved Science Week. We started by joining lots of other schools as the teachers showed us how to colour mix. We used felt tips and kitchen paper to create a rainbow fish, then we used pipettes to add droplets of water to mix the colours.

Mrs Boshi showed the children how to mix 'chemicals' to do a scientific experiment. The children were so excited when the volcano erupted and asked lots of questions "Why did the volcano erupt so fast?" "Why was it not red?"





National Science Week at Christ Church Upper Armley Primary School

Christ Church Upper Armley was full of excitement this week as pupils celebrated National Science Week with a fantastic range of hands-on investigations and experiments. Every year group had the chance to explore, ask questions, and enjoy the fun of scientific discovery.

Our EYFS pupils were thrilled to create their own exploding volcano, while across the school children experimented with exploding balloons, slime making, and designing and flying paper aeroplanes.

In Key Stage 1, pupils explored how to make a carrot float, learning about water density through simple and engaging investigation. Further up the school, some Key Stage 2 pupils looked at how to strengthen a 'backbone', using creative materials to test structure and support. Year 5 became chemists for the day, mixing everyday household items to observe interesting chemical reactions. Year 6 rounded off the week with a memorable activity—making a model of blood to understand the fascinating components that keep our bodies functioning. It was a wonderful week filled with curiosity, creativity, and discovery. A huge thank you to all staff for planning such engaging activities and well done to every pupil who took part. We can't wait to see where your scientific curiosity takes you next!


7:30am - Breakfast Club (application only)
