## Year 2 News

Year 2 have been thoroughly enjoying their learning about life cycles in both their science and writing lessons. As part of this topic, we explored the life cycle of a frog through the beautiful story

Tadpole's Promise, which sparked lots of discussion—especially because of its surprising ending!

To bring our learning to life, we have been carefully looking after our own tadpoles in the classroom. We have watched them grow and change over time, and we were very excited to see them reach the froglet stage. They are now ready for a new adventure and have been safely released into Mr Binks' pond.

We have also been learning about the butterfly life cycle. Over several weeks, we have created detailed models to show the different stages. Alongside this, we have been taking care of real caterpillars, ensuring they are well fed and ready to metamorphose into butterflies.

### Our School Day

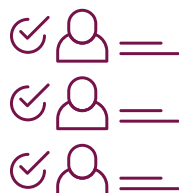
**7:30am** - Breakfast Club (application only)
